Dr. Bowers is Chair of the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology and Curator of Entomology at the CU Natural History Museum. She has been fascinated by insects since she was small and has been able to follow such an early interest throughout the rest of her life. After completing her Ph.D. at the University of Massachusetts, and a two-year post-doc at Stanford, she spent eight years on the faculty at Harvard. She has served as a University of Colorado professor since 1989.

Her interests are in the interaction of insects with their environment and other organisms, especially chemical mediation of plant-insect-enemy interactions and the effects of human alterations of the environment on these interactions. She works in a variety of systems, including butterflies and their host plants, predators and parasitoids, native bee communities, and insect immune responses to parasitoids and pathogens.


