Polly E. Bugros McLean shares insights from her book *Remembering Lucile: A Virginia Family's Rise from Slavery and a Legacy Forged a Mile High*, which explores the life of Lucile Berkeley Buchanan Jones, (1884-1989) an exceptional woman who history had forgotten and did not have a chance to author her own story. Lucile Berkeley Buchanan Jones was the first black woman to graduate from UC Boulder, graduating in 1919.

Dr. McLean has lectured, conducted workshops and research in southern Africa for USAID, UNESCO, as a Fulbright Scholar in Namibia, and a visiting professor at the University of Zambia. McLean is the recipient of numerous awards and honors including the 2014 Best Should Teach Gold Award, the 2009 Edward R. Murrow Award for teaching, and the 2007 Robert L. Stearns Award.

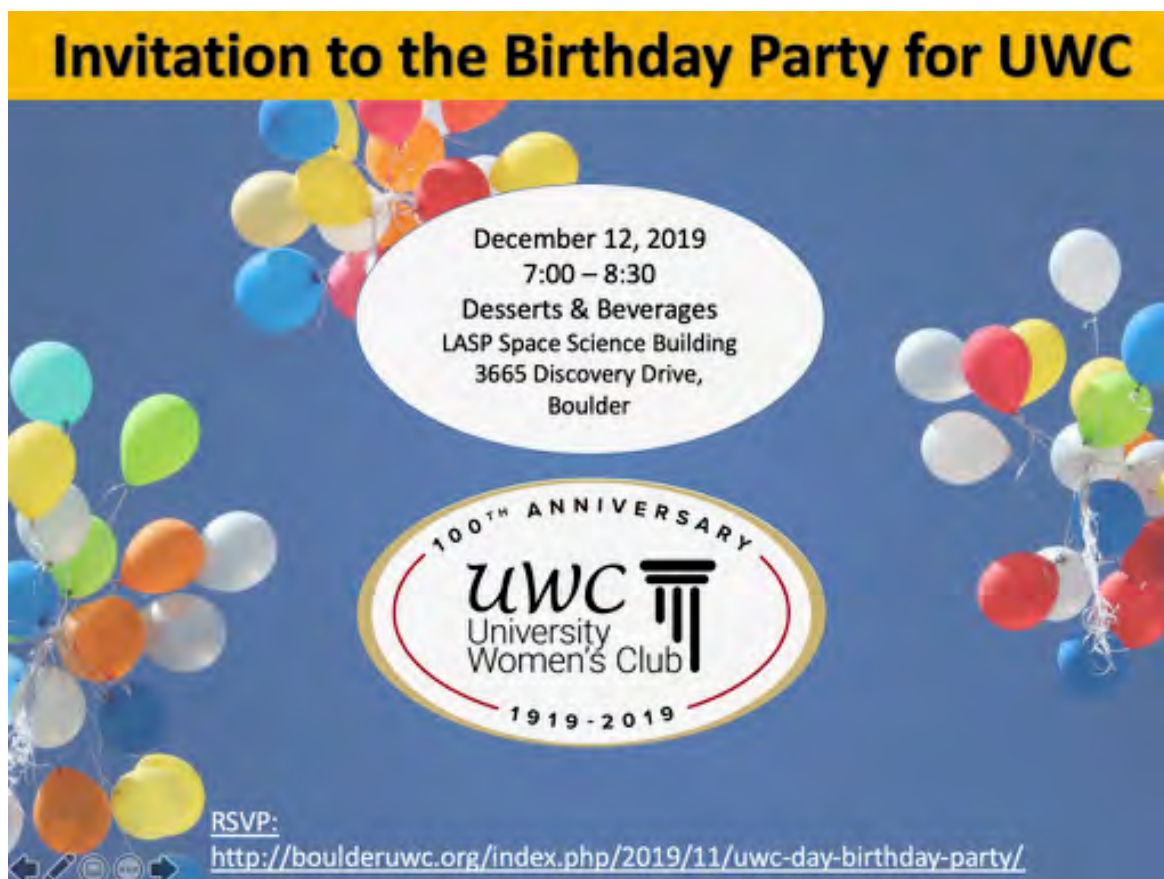
Karen Bell

In January 2016 Governor Hickenlooper named Limerick as the Colorado State Historian and served till 2018. In addition, in January 2016 she was appointed to the National Endowment for the Humanities advisory board, the National Council on the Humanities. Patty was nominated by President Obama in Spring 2015 and was confirmed by the United States Senate in November 2015.

Patty Limerick is the Faculty Director and Chair of the Board of the Center of the American West at the University of Colorado, where she is also a Professor of History.

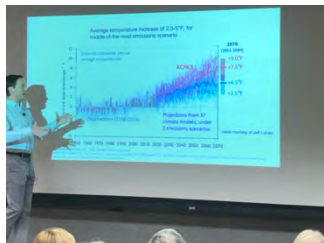

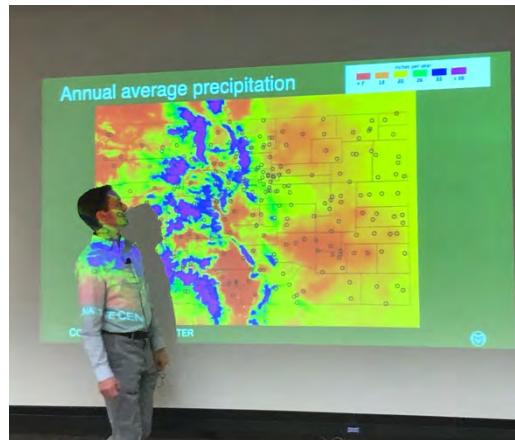

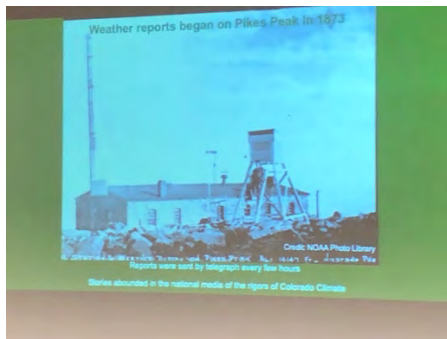

Colorado is not uniformly wet



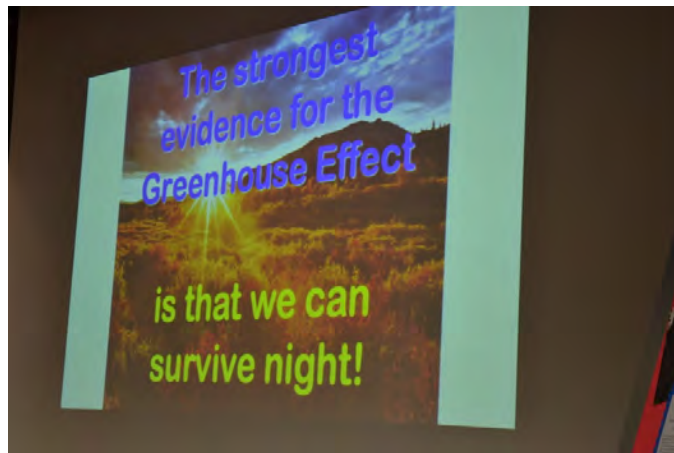
