

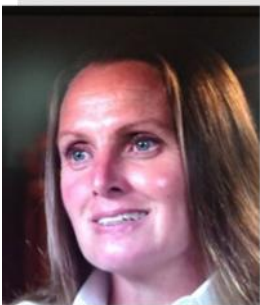


Lecture Luncheon - February 9, 2016

Human trafficking is the fastest-growing criminal industry in the world, second only to the drug trade. And Boulder, Colorado is not immune to this criminal activity.

Beth Klein is an accomplished lawyer who chooses to dedicate her life and legal skills to end human trafficking. Every year she has been voted by over 13,000 lawyers as a Super Lawyer in the State of Colorado and one of the top women lawyers.

She has won many awards, including *More Magazine* naming her as one of the 50 Women That You Want On Your Side along with Michelle Obama, Oprah Winfrey, Hillary Clinton and many other women world leaders. She received the "Woman who Changed the Heart of the City of Denver" award. She has been nominated as a CNN Hero. The Denver Post named her as one of the 12 Women of Influence in the State of Colorado.

In 2010, Beth Klein wrote a breakthrough anti-human trafficking law for Colorado, which led her to consulting to over 30 states and even to other countries, helping them to understand and create solutions to end human trafficking. She has worked all over the world, many times for free, trying to end human trafficking.

After the luncheon they sold ornaments, jewelry and other items made by the refugees to benefit their cause.



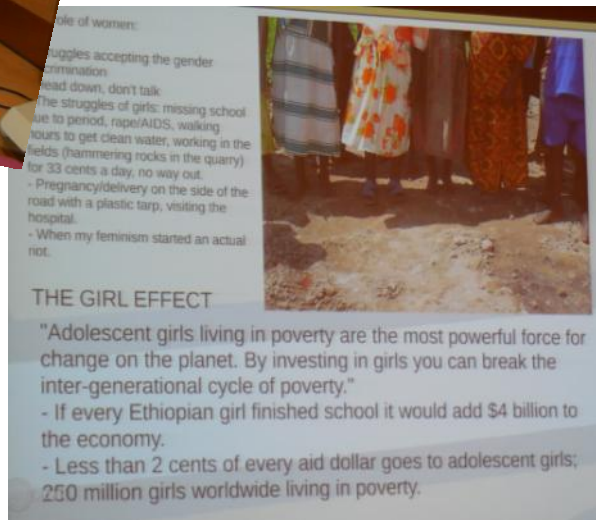
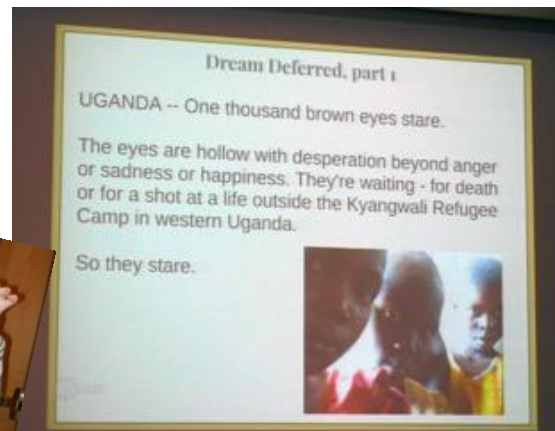
