Mary Lou Acimovic is an expert on Mild Traumatic Brain Injury. She is an advocate, therapist, and personal trainer helping people who experience on-going cognitive symptoms associated with MTBI. She recently published ***Mild Traumatic Brain Injury: The Guidebook***

Mary Lou is a former Director of the Brain Injury Program at Mapleton Center for Rehabilitation in Boulder, Colorado, with almost 40 years of clinical experience in cognitive rehabilitation and speech pathology.

This presentation will provide an overview of the brain, what happens when it is injured, how it recovers and what mild traumatic brain injury teaches us about the care and handling of our own brains. Mild brain injury gives us a unique way of studying cognitive functions.

Knowing how the brain works helps us appreciate skills we take for granted. This information is particularly useful when we are concerned with the effects of aging and want to know how we can stay sharp.

UWC Electronic Membership Directory-By-Law Change

The UWC Board recommends that the membership consider approval of a revision to our By-Laws to permit us to offer an electronic membership directory starting next year. This directory would be delivered by email only to members whose dues are currently paid. It would not be publicly available on our website. Current By-Laws permit only paper copies.

By Law Article VI. Section 2 currently reads: "Only names of members whose dues have been received and recorded before the announced deadline date will be included in the annual UWC directory."

By Law Article VI. Section 3 currently reads: "The annual UWC directory will be distributed in a paper edition by early November of the current program year to paid members. Portions of the electronic version of the directory may be distributed only to specific board members and only if it is necessary to facilitate completion of their responsibilities."

The Board recommends that the underlined sections above be deleted. The new Article VI Sections 2 and 3 would read:

Section 2 (proposed revision): "Only names of members whose dues have been received and recorded will be included in the annual UWC directory."

Section 3 (proposed revision): "The annual UWC directory will be distributed by early November of the current program year to paid members."

Discussion points: Changing to electronic distribution will allow monthly or quarterly updates throughout the year and will save the club over \$800 annual publishing and postage costs. Savings can be directed to scholarships or other worthwhile activities. Paper copies of the directory can still be made available upon request to those unable to receive electronic copies. The Board takes seriously its charge to protect the privacy of the membership directory information and will direct its membership accordingly. Many organizations have successfully moved to electronic directories that can be readily accessed and updated. The Board believes this is a positive step for our club.

Vote: A two-thirds vote of approval by the general membership at the March 11 Lecture Luncheon will be required to pass these By-Law revisions. 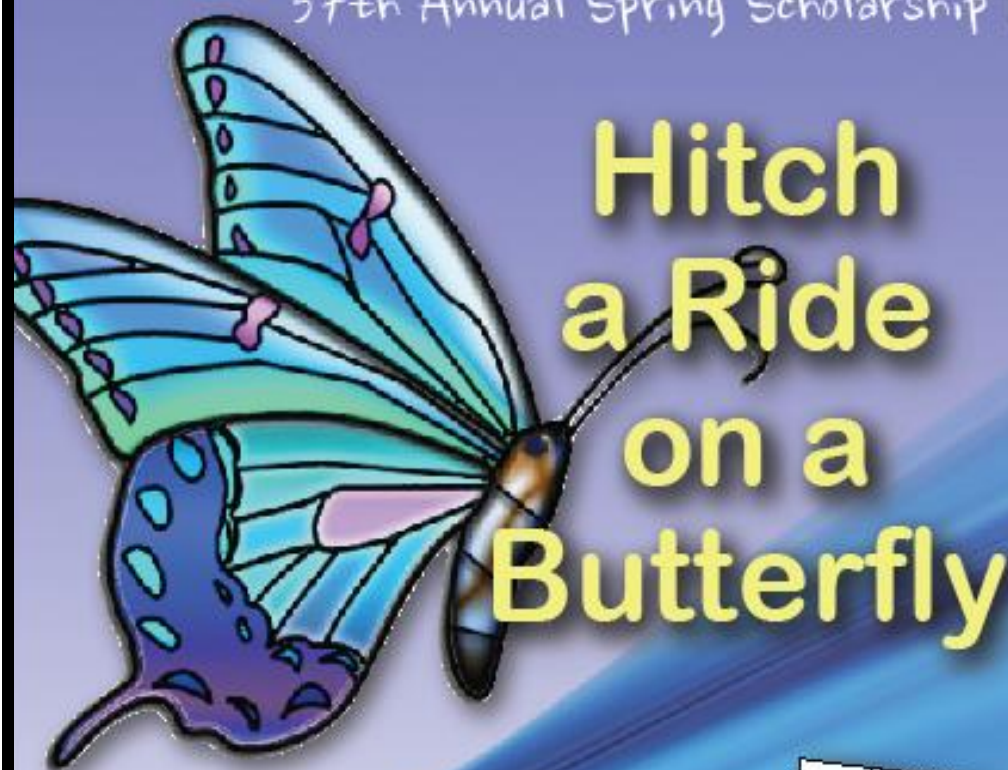

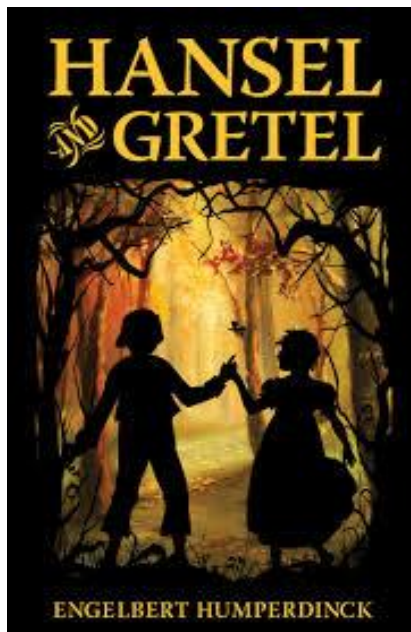

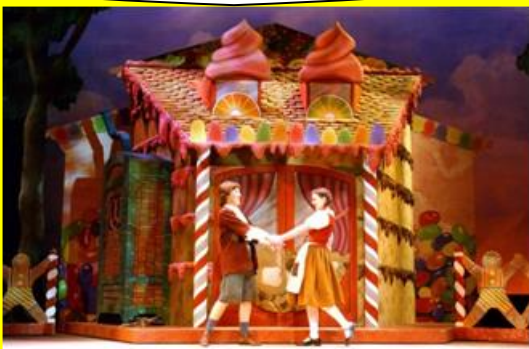

UWC Board Positions

Position	Brief description
President	An elected position. Organizes meetings of the UWC Board and oversees running of the club.
President-Elect	An elected position. Prepares to become President for the following year.
Secretary	Takes minutes of the UWC Board meetings; usually a position following elected Secretary-Elect.
Secretary-Elect	An elected position. Prepares to be Secretary for the following year.
Treasurer	Uses Quicken software to track income/expenses and prepares a budget and other financial information.
Treasurer-Elect	Learns the job of Treasurer.
Program Chair	Selects speakers and arranges catering for five Lecture Luncheons and the Fall Membership Event.
Advisory Planning/ Parliamentarian	Understands and advises on the UWC constitution and Robert's Rules of Orders for conducting meetings.
Communications	Sends notes to those members (or their loved ones) who are seriously ill and to families of those who have died. Writes notes of Thanks to those who have contributed \$50 or more over the year to the UWC Scholarships.
Email	Sends emails to members under requested circumstances.
Historian	Keeps a photographic records of events, Interest Groups, and other activities, and produces an album (hardcopy or digital) of the year's activities.
Honors Reception	Plans for Spring reception for the Margaret Willard Awardee and our honoring of new officers and the President's award.
Hospitality	Prepares a list of attendees and name tags for luncheons. Records payments received and sends them to the Treasurer.
Interest Groups	Coordinates Interest Groups and communicates with chairs of groups. Encourages formation of new groups.
Membership	Keeps Excel records of membership, including detailed information on the date of joining, contact information, and data changes. Passes information on to Board members as needed.
New Members	Keeps a record of who are the "new members" and plans the New Member wine and cheese party in the Fall. Any welcoming of these New Members is included in the job.
Membership Hand- book and Directory	Produces a Directory (hardcopy and digital) of all members who have joined by a given date in October. The included Membership Handbook provides information about UWC and its activities. Solicits and includes advertising in the Directory/Handbook.
<i>MESSAGES Newsletter</i>	Compiles the newsletter for each month (January and summer months excepted), using input from all officers, due by the 10th of the month prior to month of publication. Sends to Website chair for email distribution.
Website	Maintains UWC website and distributes <i>MESSAGES</i> to membership via email.
Nominating Committee	Heads the committee of three to five members to select candidates for nomination to Board positions of President-Elect, Secretary-Elect, and Treasurer-Elect for the following year's Board.
Opera Brunch	Selects the CU Opera performance for members to attend as a group. Arranges for venue and brunch preceding the opera, and tries to find a speaker for the brunch.
Scholarship Committee	Heads committee to select the student applicants most worthy of our UWC scholarships.
Scholarship Luncheon	Chairs the committee of our April Scholarship Luncheon, hosting our scholarship winners. Arranges for a venue, menu, and program.
Telephone Tree	Telephones non-email/internet members with regard to paying dues, upcoming events, and any special other news.
Margaret Willard Award	Heads committee to select the Margaret Willard Award recipient.
Past President	Remains on the Board for a year after being President. May have other responsibilities.
