UWC Directory and Handbook

Electronic Distribution Starting November 2014

The UWC Directory will be distributed electronically to all paid UWC members via email starting in November of this year. For those members without email, a hard copy will be delivered by hand or by mail in the new format. Electronic distribution of the directory and postage costs will save UWC approximately \$800 to \$1000 annually, which will go toward our scholarship fund. Updates of the electronic directory will be distributed monthly to the membership in PDF format. Each new version will contain updated information and a list of new members and changes for that month and recent months.

The electronic Handbook will be distributed annually. It contains information about Board Members, Calendar and Lecture Luncheons, Interest Groups, Past Presidents and the Margaret Willard Awardees. The Board thanks those who have participated in the pilot and have provided commen,ts that we have addressed in the early versions this directory. If you have any questions, please contact Directory Chair, Diana King (dianaking.boulder@gmail.com, 303-530-1860). Suggestions: We encourage you to keep the electronic version on your computer – you can drag it onto your desktop and replace it monthly. It is not necessary to reprint the electronic directory each month. The directory and handbook will be produced in horizontal format so that they can be printed, stapled in the upper left hand corner, and folded in half in order to fit into a smaller space by a phone or in a purse.

We're starting a new column in *MESSAGES* this month. We will be providing our readers with current news about people and topics from our past UWC events, speakers, and scholarship winners. For our kickoff article we are bringing you up to date on one of our past scholarship winners. Priscilla Carlson was one of four winners in 2010 for the 2010-11 academic year. After a decade of employment, she came to Colorado University to pursue her dream of higher education. In her native Midwest she had been discouraged from pursuing college studies due to her reliance on a power wheel chair for mobility.

Priscilla met every challenge with perseverance and graduated from CU in December 2012 with two degrees — a BA in Political Science and a BS in Broadcast News. After graduation Priscilla was offered continued employment at the Center for Multicultural Affairs on campus, where she had worked part time as a student. Later that year she accepted the position of Coordinator for the Colorado Statewide Independent Living Council (CO SILC): www.coloradosilc.org. The Council works with 10 independent living centers across Colorado to ensure that people with disabilities have the resources they need to live independently.



In addition to her CO SILC work, Priscilla is the co-chair of the JFK Partners Advisory Council through Anschutz Medical Campus. She serves as a guest speaker in their PA classes each semester, and as a guest speaker at Regis College. In her leisure time Priscilla has acted in two Phamaly Theatre shows, which she co-wrote with other performers. Post performance, Priscilla was invited to serve on the Phamaly board of directors. She is proud to be associated with such an amazing organization (www.phamaly.org).

On a more personal note, this past summer Priscilla was married to her college sweetheart, Dave Bahr. They are now living in Louisville. Sometime in the future Priscilla hopes to return to academia to obtain a Master's degree, but for now she is enjoying her current situation. She credits the scholarship she received from the University Women's Club with giving her the ability to focus on her academics and student involvement on campus that led to other opportunities during and after college.

We are so happy we were able to assist Priscilla and we are so proud of her achievements.


