#### **Tuesday, October 8, 2002, Aspen Room (reservation deadline October 1)**

Glenn E. Porzak, Managing Partner of Porzak Browning & Bushong LLP, will speak on "The Ultimate Challenge - The Ascent of Mt. Everest." In 1990 Glenn Porzak traveled to Mt. Everest and achieved the ambitious goal of leading the first American team to successfully climb two 27,000-foot mountains on the same expedition. In a breathtaking slide show, he chronicles his climbing adventures on the world's highest mountain, the people and geography of the Himalayas, the challenge of climbing to the summit of Mt. Everest, the effects of high altitude, and the critical importance of teamwork and leadership. Mr. Porzak is the veteran of eight Himalayan climbs and is the seventh person in the world to have achieved the Seven Summits, the highest mountain on each of the continents. He is a speaker of international reputation as his descriptions are as exciting as his globe-trotting experiences themselves.

#### **Tuesday, November 12, 2002, Room #235 (reservations deadline November 5)**

Jane Menken, Director of the Institute of Behavioral Science at CU-Boulder was named Distinguished Professor last March, one of only 33 other CU faculty who hold that title. Jane is a member of the National Academy of Sciences, and as chair of its Committee on Population is examining how the world will deal with the increasing longevity and aging of the world's population. Her main area of research has been fertility, and she will use PowerPoint and slides to demonstrate her current work in Bangladesh on the changing status of women and girls as seen through their health. Her talk is entitled, "The Effects of Childbearing on Women's Survival: New Evidence from Rural Bangladesh."

Jane Menken, Director of the Institute of Behavioral Science at CU-Boulder was named Distinguished Professor last March, one of only 33 other CU faculty who hold that title. Dr. Menken is a member of the National Academy of Sciences and, as chair of its Committee on Population, is examining how the world will deal with the increasing longevity and aging of the world's population. Her main area of research has been fertility, and she will use PowerPoint and slides to demonstrate her current work in Bangladesh on the changing status of women and girls as seen through their health.

Dr. Menken is the author of over 90 publications and author or editor of four books. She has received grants from the National Institute on Aging, the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, the Ford Foundation, the Mellon Foundation, and the Rockefeller Foundation. She is currently principal investigator of a Population Aging Center within IBS, funded by the National Institute on Aging.

University Women's Club Past-President Nancy Brown is currently completing her Ph.D. dissertation, entitled "Conscience, Conflict, and Contradiction: The Social and Cultural Construction of Refugees in the Collective Memory of France and the United States, 1940-1952." Nancy holds an M.A. and a B.A. in religion from Pepperdine University and a Certificate of Jewish Studies from Hebrew University in Jerusalem. She is a past UWC scholarship winner, and, while we have all heard her talk informally about her studies, this is our opportunity to hear in detail of her intensive research of the past several years.

Nancy will speak to us from her publication "No Longer A Haven: Varian Fry and the Refugees of France." This research focuses on the American journalist Varian Fry and the organization and administration of his rescue mission out of Marseille during 1940-41 that saved over 2,000 refugees in opposition to both French and American authorities as well as the ways in which this extraordinary effort had been ignored in the U. S. until the late 1990s. Nancy writes, "By examining France's struggle with their collective memory of Vichy, we can shed light on how the U. S. has constructed cultural amnesia of Fry's heroic accomplishments. Until 1940 both countries thought of themselves as defenders of liberty, human rights, and a haven for refugees. Thus, in both countries, it remains difficult to deal with evidence that suggests anything to the contrary."

Professor Charles Wilkinson, Distinguished Professor, University of Colorado School of Law, is also the August 2002 winner of the Hazel Barnes Prize, the University's largest single honor for teaching and research. He is internationally known for championing American Indian and Western environmental legal issues. His 12 books have moved beyond legal scholarship to a general audience with *The Eagle Bird*, *Crossing the Next Meridian*, and *Fire on the Plateau*. The *New York Times* praised *The Eagle Bird* as a book of "elegant essays. A vigorous study of (how) the development of the West has both disrupted many delicate environments and profoundly reshaped the societies that emerged on the frontier." Of *Crossing the Next Meridian*, the *Christian Science Monitor* wrote, "He is an extraordinary writer, able to tell the human stories that make up both history and law." His most recent book, *Messages from Frank's Landing: A Story of Salmon, Treaties and the Indian Way*, received the 2000 Colorado Book Award.

Among his many awards and accolades, the National Wildlife Federation presented him with its National Conservation Award. In its 10-year anniversary issue, *Outside Magazine* named him one of fifteen "People to Watch," calling him "the West's leading authority on natural resources law." He has served on the boards of

The Wilderness Society, Northern Lights Institute, and the Western Environmental Law Center, and is currently Board Chair of the Grand Canyon Trust.

Over the years, Professor Wilkinson has taken on many special assignments for the U.S. departments of Interior, Agriculture, and Justice. He served as special counsel to the Interior Department for the drafting of the Presidential Proclamation, signed by President Clinton in 1996, establishing the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument in Utah.

Professor Wilkinson is a speaker very much in national demand, and we are honored that he will speak to us about material from his book-in-progress (which has the same title as his talk).
