Barry retired from coaching following the 2004–05 campaign after 22 seasons at the reins of the Buffalo program. She became just the 24th coach in women's NCAA history to reach 500 career wins.

Crossroads in Film: Where Documentary and Fiction Intersect Kathleen Man

Tuesday, December 12, 2006 (Reservations by Tuesday, December 5)

Kathleen Man, a Fulbright winner, has been an assistant professor of film production in the Film Studies Program at the University of Colorado at Boulder since 2001, where she teaches directing, cinematography, editing, and screenwriting. She is also an independent producer, director, screenwriter, and cinematographer whose films have been shown in festivals around the world. In 2005, Kathleen produced *Kind of a Blur*, which stars Golden Globe winner Sandra Oh. In 2006, she completed her documentary on child-trafficking in Nepal, *Sita: A Girl from Jambu*, which she produced, directed, shot, and co-edited.

Currently, Kathleen is co-directing a feature-length documentary tentatively entitled *Beauty Mark*, a film that examines American society's obsession with unattainable beauty and perfection. She will show clips from *Sita* and *Beauty Mark* and will focus on how the documentary and narrative intersect.

30-year Anniversary: All the President's Men Jim Palmer Tuesday, February 13, 2007 (Reservations by Tuesday, February 6)

Jim Palmer, Professor, Director of the Conference on World Affairs, and Director of the Farrand Academic Program, has been the Film Studies Program Director, as well as Acting Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs. His work has appeared in *Literature/Film Quarterly*, and *Film* *Heritage*, among other journals. He teaches many courses including those on Humanities and Film, Jung, Film and Literature, Film and the Quest for Truth. Current Ideas in Brain Science Mark Dubin Tuesday, March 13, 2007 (Reservations by Tuesday, March 6)

Mark Dubin, husband of UWC member Alma, has been professor of Molecular, Cellular and Developmental Biology at the University of Colorado at Boulder since 1982. He received his PhD at John Hopkins University in Biophysics. In 2003, he became the Director for Faculty Development at the BP Center for Visualization at CU.

Prof. Dubin will be speaking on his current research in brain science, including his latest finding for Alzheimer's and Parkinson disease. In the last decade, a variety of new techniques have demonstrated that the adult brain is still capable of significant plasticity. Mark's current work deals with this adult plasticity.

BENEFITS OF UWC MEMBERSHIP Free E-mail/Internet Access and Buff Cards

Members who have already received Guest Buff Cards need to go first to Patron Accounts at the Circulation Desk in Norlin Library before checking out a book. Please bring your Buff Card and mention that your name is in the Enterprise Directory. The staff will access the directory and put your name into the computer file for Norlin patrons. This is especially important if you want to check out a book in a departmental library not housed within Norlin.

TREASURER'S NOTE RE 2005-06 FINANCIAL YEAR

<u>Assets</u>: At the end of the financial year, we had a total income of \$22,723.45 and total expenses of \$21,818.60 (excluding the \$250 deposit for the 2007 Spring Event) for a positive balance of \$904.85. We had a cash balance of \$11,606.88 and total assets of over \$70,000.

Outgoing: UWC contributed \$4,000 to the Endowment Fund and awarded \$5,000 in scholarships (for the 2006-07 year), and donated \$750 to the School of Music.

The By-laws Article VIII Auditing needs to be changed to read "December 31" to accommodate a practical timing for closing and auditing the books. The last bills of the year come in over the summer and August 31 is too soon for a final reconciliation.

The second proposal she made dealt with Constitution Article III Membership, Sec. 5. c. and d. Honorary Members of UWC. It is proposed to delete "c. former Presidents if female, or the wives of former Presidents of the University"; and "d. former Chancellors if female, or the wives of former Chancellors of the Boulder campus." It seems that often we cannot locate these women or they prefer not to be listed in the directory.

A vote on these proposed changes, that the UWC Board supports fully, will occur at our next general meeting (luncheon), February 13, 2007. A copy of the Constitution and By-laws will be at the check-in table. I hope you will attend, ask questions, and vote at that time. See you February 13!



Past UWC President (1989-90) Rosemary McBride passed away Sunday, February 11, leaving an indelible footprint in the city she loved. A bit of a rebel, never without a cause, her advocacy of civic, environmental, and humanitarian initiatives made a dizzying list,

spanning University Women's Club, The Dairy Center, Eco-Cycle, the YWCA, Open Space, Boulder County Democratic Women, The League of Women Voters, Meals on Wheels, countless other grass roots efforts, and a legacy of children who remember her as their preschool teacher.

She traveled extensively in her later years, visiting the Soviet Union, East Asia, the Pacific, and the Yucatan. While in Tajikistan, she picked up a striped coat that she wore for 10 years, trying to convince the City Council to complete the Boulder Dushanbe Teahouse. She would have worn it another 10, if it would help complete the Cyber Café, Boulder's return gift to her sister city. A donation in her name to that cause would win her vote. That's Rosemary, for remembrance.





Mildred W. Coffin, former UWC President (1952-53) and CU arts administrator, wife of the late Professor Berton Coffin, died March 6, 2007 in Pomona, California. Recently she lived in Boulder, Colorado, as well as in California. She was born on April 28, 1912 in McAlester, Oklahoma.

At the University of Colorado, Mrs. Coffin was an Administrative Assistant for the Special Events Committee. As Artist Series manager for over 25 years, she brought world-renowned musicians to Macky Auditorium. Additionally she worked with the Summer Session Creative Arts Program, several CU lecture series, and the Writer's Conference. With her husband she was co-recipient of the Robert L. Stearns Award for Distinguished Service to the University of Colorado-Boulder, and she was the recipient of a 20-year University Service Recognition Award. Mrs. Coffin sang professionally in throughout the United States and editorial assistant for her husbands publications.

In addition to being a President of the University Women's Club, she was active in many Boulder and Pomona, California, artistic and literary groups. She also volunteered in hospitals in both communities.

Survivors include her daughter, Dr. Martha Coffin Evans, of Boulder.


