## The First Colonization of the Americas

### James Dixon

University Memorial Center, Aspen Room

\*Please note that this lecture is scheduled 30 minutes later than our usual meeting time to accommodate Professor Dixon's teaching schedule.

Dr. James Dixon is a Fellow at the University of Colorado's Institute of Arctic and Alpine Research at Boulder, as well as Professor of Anthropology and Curator of Museum and Field Studies at CU. His research interests have been in studying human adaptations to life in areas of high latitudes and high altitudes, and in Circumpolar and Paleoindian Archeology. He has forty years of field experience in these fields. He has authored several books and numerous articles on these subjects and has appeared in a recent National Geographic Society documentary.

His conclusions support a hypothesis gaining in popularity in recent years—that the earliest migrants to North America from Asia did not walk across a

land bridge to North America, but arrived in watercraft. Integrating evidence that he and others have assimilated in Alaska and other parts of North America from human and animal remains, cultural sites, linguistics, glacial deposits, and knowledge of historic watercraft usage in the North Pacific, he will explain when and how these earliest migrants arrived on this continent.

## Helping the Body Heal Itself

Dr. Kristi Anseth holds joint appointments at the University of Colorado at Boulder as Tisone Professor of Chemical and Biological Engineering and as Associate Professor of Surgery in the School of Medicine at CU's Health Sciences Center in Denver. Trained as a chemical engineer, she has always been drawn to research with medical relevance, and she has been developing chemical polymers that can be injected into the body to aid in the regeneration of car-

tilage and heart tissue, reducing the need for invasive surgery to heal joints and damaged heart valves. In the course of a decade, she has published nearly 150 research articles, obtained 11 patents for her work, and garnered an impressive number of awards for her research and teaching.

She will discuss her current research and future horizons in the fascinating and rapidly growing field of biomedical engineering.

### **“Your Death Would Be Mine”**

Dr. Martha Hanna has an Honours B.A. from the University of Winnipeg, M.A. from the University of Toronto, and a Ph.D. from Georgetown University. She joined the History Department at the University of Colorado at Boulder as an Instructor in January 1988; she was promoted to full Professor in 2007. She has been recognized for her excellence in research and teaching by many awards, which have included a Boulder Faculty Assembly Teaching Excellence, and Outstanding Graduate Advisor in the Graduate School.

Her major field of interest is French history, with special emphasis on WWI, and she has published two books, as well as many peer-reviewed articles, essays, book reviews, and conference papers on this subject. The title of her talk is that of her most recent book—an examination of the intimate correspondence between a young French peasant soldier and his wife in the context of the Great War, and the impact of that war on life in rural France.

### **“Answering the Call of the Court: How Justices and Litigants set the Supreme Court’s Agenda”**

Dr. Vanessa Baird earned a B.A. in German literature and a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Houston, and came to the University of Colorado at Boulder in 2000 as Assistant Professor in the Department of Political Science. She has published numerous articles in peer-reviewed journals, book reviews, and conference papers, and was recognized in 2006 as Teacher of the Year in CU’s Department of Political Science.

Dr. Baird’s research interests include understanding the process by which courts acquire legitimacy, the causes and effects of the perception of procedural justice, and the mechanism by which courts can rely on extra-judicial resources to amass political power. The title of her talk is that of her first book, which was published by the University of Virginia Press in 2007. In this talk, she will challenge traditional views that Supreme Court agendas are set by activist judges and ineffective legislation, and present her conclusion that the court agendas depend on policy entrepreneurs who systematically respond to the priorities and preferences of Supreme Court justices.

### **“Hamlet in Vladivostok?”**

Philip Sneed is a seasoned director, actor, writer, and teacher of theatre. He graduated from the University of Colorado with a B.F.A. in Theatre and returned to Boulder last year as Producing Artistic Director of the Colorado Shakespeare Festival after gaining an impressive background in performing, directing, and teaching in the western United States. He has received several awards in the performing arts—including “Best Cultural Exchange” for a presentation of *Ivanov* performed in Russian with simultaneous translation.

Mr. Sneed expanded CSF productions in 2007 to include two non-Shakespearean plays as well as a new seasonal event—a production of “A Child’s Christmas in Wales.” In his talk he will explain the evolution of CSF’s 2008 program, and he will share his passion for exploring new horizons in theatre and his vision for the future of the Colorado Shakespeare Festival.



## 2007-2008 UWC Scholars

The UWC Scholarship Committee reviewed 37 applications and selected five scholars for the 2007-08 academic year. Committee members were Linda Garby, Kate Mangione, Martha McGavin, Jeanne Nauenberg, June Saunders, and Karon Johnson, Chair.

The qualifications for the scholarship were altered this year in response to the university's recent ruling that gender not be a qualification for CU-Boulder scholarships; no university awards were made this year to scholarships that included female as a requirement. In order that the UWC scholarship be included in the university's online application (this is our only source of applicants) it was decided to eliminate the gender qualification in our scholarships. Applicants were evaluated on the basis of our established criteria of a student who is: a Colorado resident; at least 24 years of age; and has completed at least 12 semester hours with a 3.0 GPA. Financial need, initiative and community service were considered.

The following students are the 2007-2008 University Women's Club scholars.

### **Jennifer Donnelly \$3,000**

Jennifer Donnelly, a nontraditional 36-year-old student and mother of two, is an avid volunteer in the university and Boulder community. With a 3.8 GPA she serves as a role model for her children, as well as her college peers. A transfer student from Pueblo Community College, Jennifer is majoring in psychology and serving as a Teaching Assistant – which is unusual for an undergraduate, and certainly recognition of her academic achievements. Jennifer pursues “knowledge to better serve society.”

### **Robyn Marcotte \$1,500**

A single parent with a “long list of inadequate skills,” Robyn Marcotte determined that returning to school was the only way she could be financially self sufficient. A two-year stint and 4.0 GPA at Front Range Community College led her to CU Boulder and an English and Philosophy major. Interested in the publishing industry, she plans to go to graduate school at the University of Denver Publishing Institute and is committed to causes in the community that she feels passionate about – in particular, women's issues.

### **Rasmin Clark \$1,500**

Rasmin Clark grew up on an isolated wilderness farm in a religious cult. At the age of twelve, she took a writing class – a class that opened her mind to express ideas rather than simply receiving them. Most of her friends were married at thirteen, all to older men, but this writing class opened a Pandora's Box that led her eventually to CU-Boulder and a creative writing major. Her desire is to “hone her writing skills” in order to write about her experience as a woman and in a religious cult. CU affords her the opportunity to address these issues and learn to express them professionally.

### **Kimberly Edwards \$1,000**

Kimberly Edwards's life came to a screeching halt in February 2003 when she was in a serious auto accident. Severe head and back injuries resulted in the loss of her job, her home, and a relationship. After months of healing she began to alter her professional goals. Helping others with the compassion and insight she gained from this experience led her to medical missions in Guatemala, assisting in the establishment of village clinics in remote mountainous areas. She is rebuilding her life with the goal of attending medical school.

### **Deborah Ann Griffin \$1,000**

Deborah Ann Griffin raised two children while building a successful commercial fishing business and working as a Licensed Practical Nurse in Alaska. A Fairview High School graduate, she began college at CU-Boulder, but withdrew when her brother died. Life took her far and wide. With her children grown, at age 56, she returned to Colorado and CU-Boulder, where she is pursuing an English degree and plans to get a teaching certificate. She recognizes the “necessity and privilege of a college education.”

## Rhetoric and Reality in Ancient Persia

Dr. Dusinberre is an archaeologist in the Classics Department at CU-Boulder. She grew up in Boulder where, as a young girl, she fell in love with Greek literature and art. Later, as an undergraduate at Harvard and torn between Classics and Geology, she took a year off to live and work in West Berlin. There she was inspired to change her major to Classical Archaeology. She completed her A.B. at Harvard and then entered graduate school at the University of Michigan, subsequently joining digs at several Middle East sites and spending a year at the American School of Classical Studies in Athens. She joined the CU-Boulder Classics department in 2000 where she is now an Associate Professor. She has become well known for an enthusiastic teaching style, which has been recognized by many teaching awards including the prestigious Chancellor's Award.

The connections and contradictions between rhetoric and reality have been a constant feature of human power plays. This talk explores those tensions in the context of the Achaemenid Persian empire (ca. 550–330 BCE), an empire that was eventually conquered by Alexander the Great and reached, at its greatest extent, from the Aegean Sea to the Indus River, from Egypt to the modern Central Asian Republics. Its people were correspondingly diverse. The art and architecture of the period both reflect the diversity of the empire and proclaim a central theme: a harmonious world order thanks to a benevolent and beneficent king. The overarching message of Achaemenid imperial art was one of a world under control, a world in which the population joined in harmonious service to the king. This talk will consider imperial Achaemenid artistic rhetoric and the reality of one particular province under Persian control: Lydia, in western Anatolia (modern Turkey).

She has published nearly 150 research articles, obtained 11 patents for her work, and garnered an impressive number of awards for her research and teaching. She will talk about her research in tissue engineering.

Tissue engineering is an interdisciplinary field that marries the principles of engineering and the life sciences toward the development of biological substitutes that restore, maintain, or improve tissue function. Typically, tissue engineers use advanced biomaterials that serve as scaffolds for the delivery of cells, and the scaffolds further provide cues and signals to the cells to guide their re-growth or healing of a tissue. One of the products of tissue engineering, a temporary skin substitute, is already being used to treat patients with burns and diabetic ulcers. This talk will provide three examples to illustrate the complexities of designing tissue engineering strategies to (1) heal damaged cartilage, (2) engineer living heart valves, and (3) treat Parkinson's disease and other neurological disorders. Finally, all of this will be placed in the context of the many scientific and regulatory challenges that exist and provide insight related to the future promise of this field in clinical medicine.

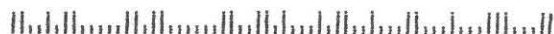

It may be difficult. It may be uncomfortable at first. But once you get past these hurdles, change is good.


#### *9. Purge Your Mind of Negative Thoughts*

Dr. Vanessa Baird earned a B.A. in German Literature and a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Houston, and came to the University of Colorado at Boulder in 2000 as Assistant Professor in the Department of Political Science. She has published numerous articles in peer-reviewed journals, book reviews, and conference papers, and was recognized in 2006 as Teacher of the Year in CU's Department of Political Science.

Dr. Baird's research interests include understanding the process by which courts acquire legitimacy, the causes and effects of the perception of procedural justice, and the mechanism by which courts can rely on extra-judicial resources to amass political power. The title of her talk is that of her first book, which was published by the University of Virginia Press in 2007. In this talk, she will challenge traditional views that Supreme Court agendas are set by activist judges and ineffective legislation, and present her conclusion that the court agendas depend on policy entrepreneurs who systematically respond to the priorities and preferences of Supreme Court justices.
