

Fun with Ultracold Atoms Deborah Jin



NIST Fellow, Quantum Physics Division JILA Fellow Professor Adjoint, Physics Department, University of Colorado, Boulder

Deborah Jin was selected as one of five regional winners of the 2013 For Women in Science Awards. The awards are presented annually by the L'Oréal Foundation and UNESCO to recognize outstanding women worldwide who significantly advance science. Jin was selected by an international jury led by Nobel Laureate Ahmed Zewail "for having been the first to cool down molecules so much that she can observe chemical reactions in slow motion which may help further understanding of molecular processes."

Professor Deborah Jin and her team invented an ingenious method of cooling molecules down to near absolute zero, the lowest possible temperature, which has the effect of slowing the molecules down. In fact, they slow down enough for researchers to actually see what goes on during chemical reactions. The study of ultracold molecules could lead to new precision-measurement tools, new methods for quantum computing and help us better understand materials that are essential to technology.

Her research focuses on ultracold trapped atoms. Her experiments use laser cooling, magnetic trapping, and evaporative cooling to reach temperatures below one microKelvin, where quantum statistics dominate the behavior of atoms.






Spotlight on Spanish Conversation Interest Group


Margaret Willard began her career at CU as an English Instructor, wife of an history professor, and became the first president of the Faculty Wives' Club which has evolved into a more encompassing group, our University Women's Club. Though the original group liked to chat and sip tea, they grew in involvement in philanthropic matters. According to Sylvia Pettem, a Boulder local historian, these included providing eye-glasses and books to needy students, milk funds for schools, implementing student loans, and more.

The social aspects of their lives turned more and more to helping others as the world progressed through the Great Depression and World War II. By 1957, they added fund raising and expanded the philanthropic work by providing financial scholarships for women, non-traditional females, who would not otherwise have been able to continue their education. We continue this tradition and recently have included men for scholarship consideration. Now UWC has grown to include interest and service groups and accept all women whether they have a CU association or not.

Since 1993, in May, at the Honors Reception, we present the Margaret Willard to a woman or women who have exemplified the traits of our predecessors, and in doing so honor all women. Past recipients have included Becky Roser, Patricia Limerick, Val Havlick, Carlen Penfold, Ruth M. Wright, Claudine Garby, and Ceal Barry. All our honorees are exemplary role models who exercise initiative in their endeavors and in doing so bring honor to all women and to our University.





The fundamental biological question stems from the desire to understand how the cells control the metals, which can reveal the origins of various diseases and conditions like prostate cancer or neurodegeneration.

From the molecular to the cellular to the organismal level, the processes of life are intricately organized in both space and time. The development of fluorescent tools for live-cell imaging **is transforming biology** by enabling interrogation of specific proteins, molecules, and ions in cells with unprecedented spatial and temporal resolution.

Professor Palmer has been awarded a Sloan Foundation Research Fellowship (2010, Chemistry), NSF CAREER award (2010), and Ed Stiefel Young Investigator Award in Biological Inorganic Chemistry (2010), and is the Chair elect of the Cell Biology of Metals Gordon Research Conference (2015).

background information.



Palmer leads a lab team working to develop fluorescent tools to track the location and movement of individual particles—molecules, ions, and proteins—within a cell.

The fundamental biological question stems from the desire to understand how the cells control the metals, which can reveal the origins of various diseases and conditions like prostate cancer or neurodegeneration.

From the molecular to the cellular to the organismal level, the processes of life are intricately organized in both space and time. The development of fluorescent tools for live-cell imaging **is transforming biology**.

In addition to developing methods for imaging metal ions, the research group is establishing new techniques for visualizing how bacterial pathogens infect mammalian host cells. Bacterial pathogens such as *Salmonella* have evolved a sophisticated mechanism for invading and taking over mammalian host cells.

Come learn about your body cells – and where this research will take us in the future with possible prevention/ intervention of certain diseases.







Best, Mary Huffman UWC President The UWC Board recommends that the membership consider approval of a revision to our By-Laws to permit us to offer an electronic membership directory starting next year. This directory would be delivered by email only to members whose dues are currently paid. It would not be publicly available on our website. Current By-Laws permit only paper copies.

By Law Article VI. Section 2 currently reads: "Only names of members whose dues have been received and recorded <u>before the announced deadline date</u> will be included in the annual UWC directory."

By Law Article VI. Section 3 currently reads: "The annual UWC directory will be distributed <u>in a</u> <u>paper edition</u> by early November of the current program year to paid members. <u>Portions of the</u> <u>electronic version of the directory may be distributed only to specific board members and only if it</u> <u>is necessary to facilitate completion of their responsibilities."</u>

The Board recommends that the underlined sections above be deleted. The new Article VI Sections 2 and 3 would read:

Section 2 (proposed revision): "Only names of members whose dues have been received and recorded will be included in the annual UWC directory."

Section 3 (proposed revision): "The annual UWC directory will be distributed by early November of the current program year to paid members."

<u>Discussion points</u>: Changing to electronic distribution will allow monthly or quarterly updates throughout the year and will save the club over \$800 annual publishing and postage costs. Savings can be directed to scholarships or other worthwhile activities. Paper copies of the directory can still be made available upon request to those unable to receive electronic copies. The Board takes seriously its charge to protect the privacy of the membership directory information and will direct its membership accordingly. Many organizations have successfully moved to electronic directories that can be readily accessed and updated. The Board believes this is a positive step for our club.

<u>Vote</u>: A two-thirds vote of approval by the general membership at the March 11 Lecture Luncheon will be required to pass these By-Law revisions. In addition, she is working on her honors thesis, a novel, for her English/Creative Writing degree, which she hopes to publish upon graduation.

Layne was successful in her proposal, with faculty, to the Board of Regents to name Neuroscience as an official degree. She is already in discussion with possible future employers, taking advantage of her dual major of Neuroscience and Computer Science, and with CU about continuing her education in the PhD program in Computer Science.

Fredy presented Kathy with a sunflower, an expression of appreciation. He works part time for CU Facilities Management in their CAD-Department and will graduate this May with a major in Environmental Design. He plans to work in his field of architecture for a year and to volunteer with Habitat for Humanity or a similar non-profit before attending graduate school.



Lorenz had the insight that a small change in initial conditions can have a dramatic effect on later events, or as he titled a 1972 paper "Predictability: Does the Flap of a Butterfly's Wings in Brazil Set off a Tornado in Texas?" In the early 1960's, Ellen Gille worked for Lorenz as a computer programmer and entered the same data over several times and got different results. President's Message

Greetings UWC Members!

I hope everyone is enjoying our extra hour of sunlight and the promise of spring. Our Board has been having some lively discussions about a myriad of subjects. One in particular is the change concerning our Membership Booklet going electronic. This has led to a lot of questions and discussions concerning the safety of information in the digital age.

If you have never done so, go to Google and put your name and the town you live in into the search field. For example: Mary Huffman + Boulder, CO. It will surprise you what pops up or what doesn't. I am a fairly public person, so a lot comes up about me and my profession.



What was surprising to me was when I was in Illinois visiting my parents last week, I Googled my 93-year-old father. I was astonished by the information that came up: his address, his age, and historical information about his life. This made me realize that privacy really is a thing of the past!

When my children signed up for Facebook accounts, I warned them about posting certain types of content. It is interesting to note that potential employers will look at Facebook profiles to learn more about potential employees, and also to check up on current employees.

Note: Don't call in sick and post on Facebook that you went skiing. I even had a co-worker tell me that after she posted her departure to Mexico on Facebook, her insurance broker called her up and chewed her out. Why announce to the world that your house will be empty for 10 days?

So how do we stay safe when we are using computers? With all the talk about identity theft, a few precautions are warranted:

- 1. Delete all suspicious emails without opening them. Be especially careful when opening attachments to emails.
- 2. Beware of "Phishing" scams that begin as legitimate looking emails asking you to provide your password or other confidential information either in a response to the email or into a website. If you are unsure, always call the company sending the emails using telephone numbers they have previously provided to verify any requests for information.
- 3. Do not send confidential information via email. This typically is not secure unless you know it is encrypted when sent over the Internet.
- 4. Check to be sure that commercial websites you visit utilize secure transmission measures (usually Secure Sockets Layer or SSL), typically indicated by a key or padlock icon along the lower section of your screen, or the address starts with https://. This is likely the case with financial institutions and major online retailers. Always check to make sure.
- **5.** Always log out of websites that require an ID and password instead of just exiting or continuing to browse other sites. This ensures that your confidential information is properly deleted from both the vendors system and your PC.

Computers are here to stay, so use a few precautions, and stay safe out there!

Margaret Willard Award and Honors Reception

Margaret Willard began her career at CU as an English Instructor, wife of a history professor, and became the first president of the Faculty Wives' Club that has evolved into a more encompassing group, our University Women's Club. Though the original group liked to chat and sip tea, they grew in involvement in philanthropic matters. According to Sylvia Pettem, a Boulder local historian, these included providing eyeglasses and books to needy students, milk funds for schools, implementing student loans, and more.

The social aspects of their lives turned more and more to helping others as the world progressed through the Great Depression and World War II. By 1957, they added fund raising and expanded the philanthropic work by providing financial scholarships for women, nontraditional females, who would not otherwise have been able to continue their education. **We continue this tradition** and recently have included men for scholarship consideration. Now UWC has grown to include interest and service groups and accepts all women whether they have a CU association or not.

Since 1993, in May, at the Honors Reception, we present the Margaret Willard Award to a woman or women who have exemplified the traits of our predecessors, and in doing so honor all women. Past recipients have included Becky Roser, Patricia Limerick, Val Havlick, Carlen Penfold, Ruth M. Wright, Claudine Garby, and Ceal Barry. All our honorees are exemplary role models who demonstrate initiative in their endeavors and in doing so, bring honor to all women.

UWC 2014 Scholarship Winners - Congratulations!

UWC has been awarding scholarships to nontraditional/mature CU students since 1982 and through 2013, we have distributed more than \$170,000 to deserving students. We are very proud to report that \$20,000 will be awarded to this year's winners. This is all a result of the generous donations our UWC members have made directly toward our UWC Scholarships and to our CU Foundation Endowment Fund.

Thank you UWC Scholarship Committee (Pat Hagerty and Kathy Randall, co-chairs; Marilyn Moses, Becky Palmer, and Yael Sears, members) who have selected the following students as recipients of the UWC Scholarships for 2014-15.

Anna Boyd: In the years following high school graduation, Anna worked and volunteered in a number of outdoor and wilderness activities including guiding whitewater rafting and dogsled adventures. While employed as a field guide for a wilderness therapy program in North Carolina, Anna worked with teenage girls struggling with emotional issues, often stemming from sexual assault. Positive results from her interactions in this experience spurred Anna to return to Colorado to pursue her education in Psychology and Women and Gender Studies. After receiving her BA in Psychology, Anna hopes to earn a graduate degree and embark on a career in helping individuals recover from traumatic experiences and educating the perpetrators of those traumas.

Amanda Gardner: While in high school, Amanda studied Latin because she knew it would help her with her anticipated nursing career. Although she continued the practical route toward nursing, she had fallen in love with Latin and after working in the medical field for some years, she realized that her ultimate happiness depended on a career change. She enrolled at CU with a major in Classics. In addition to serving as a Red Cross volunteer, Amanda currently tutors Latin at Boulder High School and CU and assists with the Junior Classical League and Latin Club. Upon graduation she hopes to teach Latin in secondary school.

Samantha Moyer: Samantha grew up in an educationally depressed area in a family that did not prize academics. While she had hoped to attend college directly after high school, she did not have the family support necessary to do so. She worked and saved and took classes at a community college and later continued selfdirected study abroad. Samantha is a highly talented vocalist and harpist who performed in the USA and Europe. She has enrolled at CU to obtain a degree in Music Education so she can encourage and support others, like herself, for whom higher education requires self-direction.

Christian Ortiz-Torres: As a member of the CU GoldShirt Program that provides talented students with enhanced preparation to assist them on the path to success in Engineering and Applied Science, Christian has distinguished himself by being selected as Mentor Program Group Chair and Summer Ready Program Mentor. He also participates in SHPE/MAES (Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers/Mexican American Engineers and Scientists Society) at CU and has held positions as the society's secretary and as financial account manager. Christian has had some gaps in his education due to serious health issues, but he is now in recovery and ready to continue his path toward a BS in Aerospace Engineering.


The show, "Dynamic Earth" and a "Fly-Over," will be hosted by none other than the Director of the Planetarium, Doug Duncan.
