DRIVE and PARK or PARK and RIDE? HOW TO ATTEND EVENTS AT UMC

Euclid Parking Update

As some of you may know, CU is planning a major remodel of the Euclid Parking Garage. At the time of this writing, the Euclid Garage remains open and you will be able to park there for the Membership Coffee and upcoming Lecture Luncheons. However, the payment scheme for parking there has changed. The lot is no longer manned. Instead, you purchase parking at a paystation located near each pedestrian exit. Following the prompts at the paystation, you enter your car license plate number and pay in cash or by credit card. The parking price is \$2.00 per hour for up to 3 hours and can be purchased in increments. You do not need to put the receipt onto your car dashboard.

Consider Taking the Bus

Unless you are carpooling and sharing the cost of parking, it may be more cost effective to take the bus. Several bus routes, including the SKIP, the 204, and the DASH, stop on Broadway very close to the University Memorial Center (UMC). Other buses, including the STAMPEDE and the HOP, stop on 18th Street just behind UMC.

You can figure out the best route from your house by using the RTD Trip Planner http://www.rtd-denver.com/GoogleTripPlanner.shtml .

You enter the address from which you are starting (your house), enter the address at which you want to end (Broadway and Euclid Ave, Boulder) and the time at which you want to arrive. Click "Plan Your Trip" and RTD will figure out your choice of routes including any transfers you have to make. Some bus stops have shelters, many bus stops have benches, and all bus stops are marked by a red and white sign that lists all routes that stop at that location.

If there is no easy bus route from your house, you can start at a Park and Ride or plan some shopping at the 29th Street Mall before or after the UWC event and park there. The HOP is an easy ride from the mall and runs about every 10 minutes. Catch the clockwise bus on 29th Street just across from Macy's entrance. It will take you to 18th Street behind UMC. When you return, take the counter-clockwise bus from the east side of 18th Street. The HOP goes in a loop, so either direction will get you there, but it is a shorter route on the south side of the loop.

The one-way fare on the bus is \$2.25 but for Seniors it is only \$1.10. You need to pay with the exact amount or use a ticket from a 10-ride booklet which you buy at the bus station (\$20 regular; \$10 Senior).

If you are riding two different buses, **be sure to ask for a transfer**, which you show the driver on the second bus. If you are lucky enough to have an EcoPass, you ride for free.

If you are still a little nervous about riding the bus, see RTD's six steps for "How To Ride Bus."

Tell Me More... About Vanessa Frambes Barbarísí

Vanessa Frambes received a UWC Scholarship for the 2008-2009 academic year. Vanessa credits the support of Boulder's University Women's Club with helping to build her self-esteem. She had gone back to school as a single mother and was working to balance care for her son, a part-time job, and school. She says that being recipient of the UWC scholarship pushed her to do her best. She did not want to let down a group that had shown such faith in her. Her years at CU were an especially tight time for Vanessa financially, and the UWC funds were important in reducing the financial burden of tuition and books.

Vanessa demonstrated leadership, initiative and service early in her life. While still in high school she co-founded an anti-violence campaign. As a single mother balancing childcare and work, Vanessa still found time to continue her activist start, volunteering with a superfund cleanup, MESA (Moving to End Sexual Assault), DARE (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) and the Special Olympics. In her scholarship application she stated, "I came from a poor family but I have a rich life."

Vanessa has continued her rich life. She graduated in August 2010 with a degree in Distributive Studies. The part-time job she had while at CU turned into a very successful career as a consultant for energy efficiency programs across the US. She works as a Project Manager with The Cadmus Group, interacting with commissions, regulatory bodies, and electric and gas utilities to help evaluate the effectiveness of their energy efficiency and conservation programs. She loves her job and feels that she is working toward leaving the planet in a better condition than it was when she came into it.



Vanessa feels that her family life is where she is extra fortunate. She met a man she describes as amazing who took on her son, James, now 8, as his own. They were married in 2014 and now have a baby, Eli, 6 months old. Vanessa's husband stays at home with their two sons which allows Vanessa to continue to grow the career that she is so passionate about. In their spare time the family enjoys fly fishing, camping, biking, skiing and visiting their families on opposite coastlines.

Dr. Bruce Jakosky, a CU Professor of Geological Sciences and the Faculty Research Associate for the Laboratory for Atmospheric and Space Physics (LASP), is the principal investigator for the Mars Atmosphere and Volatile EvolutioN mission (MAVEN), which gives scientists insight into the history of Mars' atmosphere and climate, liquid water, and planetary habitability. In April 2015, MAVEN had made 1,000 orbits. By the 2030's, it is expected that a man will be sent to Mars.

Jakosky has been involved with many spacecraft missions including Viking, Explorer, and Clementine, and he is involved in planning future spacecraft missions. He has published the books *The Search for Life on Other Planets* and *The Search for Life in the Universe*. He is an expert on extraterrestrial life. He heads CU's team in the NASA Astrobiology Institute. He serves on numerous national advisory committees.

MAVEN, launched on November 18, 2013, arrived in the orbit of Mars on September 21, 2014. What have we learned since? What do we hope to learn in the future?

DRIVE and PARK or PARK and RIDE? HOW TO ATTEND EVENTS AT UMC

Euclid Parking Update

As some of you may know, CU is planning a major remodel of the Euclid Parking Garage. At the time of this writing, the Euclid Garage remains open and you will be able to park there for upcoming Lecture Luncheons. However, the payment scheme for parking there has changed. The lot is no longer manned. Instead, you purchase parking at a paystation located near each pedestrian exit. Following the prompts at the paystation, you enter your car license plate number and pay in cash or by credit card. The parking price is \$2.00 per hour for up to 3 hours and can be purchased in increments. You do not need to put the receipt onto your car dashboard.

Consider Taking the Bus

Unless you are carpooling and sharing the cost of parking, it may be more cost effective to take the bus. Several bus routes, including the SKIP, the 204, and the DASH, stop on Broadway very close to the University Memorial Center (UMC). Other buses, including the STAMPEDE and the HOP, stop on 18th Street just behind UMC.

You can figure out the best route from your house by using the RTD Trip Planner http://www.rtd-denver.com/GoogleTripPlanner.shtml .

You enter the address from which you are starting (your house), enter the address at which you want to end (Broadway and Euclid Ave, Boulder), and the time at which you want to arrive. Click "Plan Your Trip" and RTD will figure out your choice of routes including any transfers you have to make. Some bus stops have shelters, many bus stops have benches, and all bus stops are marked by a red and white sign that lists all routes that stop at that location.

If there is no easy bus route from your house, you can start at a Park and Ride or plan some shopping at the 29th Street Mall before or after the UWC event and park there. The HOP is an easy ride from the mall and runs about every 10 minutes. Catch the clockwise bus on 29th Street just across from Macy's entrance. It will take you to 18th Street behind UMC. When you return, take the counter-clockwise bus from the east side of 18th Street. The HOP goes in a loop, so either direction will get you there, but it is a shorter route on the south side of the loop.

The one-way fare on the bus is \$2.25, but for Seniors it is only \$1.10. You need to pay with the exact amount or use a ticket from a 10-ride booklet, which you buy at the bus station (\$20 regular; \$10 Senior).

If you are riding two different buses, **be sure to ask for a transfer**, which you show the driver on the second bus. If you are lucky enough to have an EcoPass, you ride for free.

If you are still a little nervous about riding the bus, see RTD's six steps for "How To Ride Bus."

Tell Me More... About Alan Cass



After 47 years as curator of the Glenn Miller Archive, Alan Cass retired on July 1, 2015. Alan Cass was a speaker at our Lecture Luncheon of October 9, 2012, entertaining us with background and information about Glenn Miller, one of the best known and widely acclaimed leaders of the Big Band Era, and an alumnus of the University of Colorado.

Alan Cass spent much of his career building and maintaining memorabilia of Glenn Miller. Beginning with a simple Glenn Miller

display at UMC in 1969, the archive grew beyond even Mr. Cass's expectations. The relationships developed with musicians, broadcasters, producers, collectors, friends, and music lovers from around the world resulted in the 56 collections that comprise the extensive Glenn Miller Archive, serving scholars, students, and the public.

Thomas Riis, director of the American Music Research Center at CU said that "Alan has worked tirelessly for most of his life in Boulder to get the message out that Glenn Miller's home and heart were in Colorado and at CU. We need to appreciate this fact and help to preserve Alan's work and the music of the Big Band era."

In addition to being curator of the Glenn Miller Archive, Alan Cass was director of the Coors Events Center and served as public address announcer for the Buffs and the Broncos.

UWC wishes him well in his retirement.

About the Wild Animal Sanctuary in Keenesburg, CO

The November 2014 *MESSAGES* updated you about the amazing rescue of 25 abused Bolivian circus lions by the Wild Animal Sanctuary. Executive Director Pat Craig was speaker at our October 2010 Lecture Luncheon.

The Wild Animal Sanctuary is in the news again due to a change in their visit charge and donation structure. There will no longer be "entrance fees" to visit the Sanctuary. Instead, "Active Supporters" – those who donate a minimum of \$200 per year – and their guests, will be allowed unlimited entry.

Persons who are not yet Active Supporters can make an "Evaluation Donation" of \$50 for their first visit. Craig explained that the actual cost per visitor is nearly \$30 per visit, not nearly covered by the previous entrance fees.

He reminds us that the institution was never created for display of animals, but was always a sanctuary for rescued animals and was closed to the public for its first 22 years.

Dr. Elizabeth Fenn received her BA in History from Duke University and her Master's from Yale. She left her doctoral project at Yale to enter the auto mechanical program at Durham Technical Community College and worked as a mechanic for a while. Her PhD dissertation, Pox Americana, covered the 1775-82 North American smallpox epidemic. She was interviewed on multiple national news outlets about biological warfare after the 9/11 attacks.

She taught at George Washington University and Duke before joining CU in 2012 where she is now Chair of CU's History Department and Associate Professor of Ethnic Studies.

One of American journalism's highest honors, the **2015 Pulitzer Prize for History**, was awarded to Dr. Fenn for her book, *Encounters at the Heart of the World: A History of the Mandan People. A native American tribe*, the Mandans, had villages in what is now known as North Dakota and with whom the Louis and Clark expedition camped in its first winter of 1804-05. Dr. Fenn says, "My pitch is that stories like this need to be a part of the early American canon. We need to think of early America as far bigger and more interesting than the thirteen English colonies. I am so pleased that the Mandans are getting the historical recognition they are due."

She worked on this book for ten years. She is now working on a book about Sacajawea.

Dr. Fenn will have the "*Encounters...*" book and also the *Pox Americana: The Great Smallpox Epidemic of 1775-82* book for sale at the luncheon (for cash/check only).

Scholarship Donations—Cost of Tuition

Recent headlines in the Daily Camera were **"Freshman face sticker shock with first bill"** and **"Soaring student loan burden poses risk to economic growth."** These articles emphasize the financial need of today's college students and their families as they struggle to get a basic undergraduate education.

The cost of tuition and fees at CU this year for an in-state student in Arts and Sciences, taking 30 credit hours is \$11,091. Coupled with the minimum of \$13,000 for room and board the total **is nearly \$25,000**. Remember, this is for an IN-STATE student. Shockingly expensive!!

But it isn't over when the student graduates. Many are faced with years of debt, repaying student loans that average \$29,000 per student. This negatively impacts the economy affecting all of us because those with the loan burdens often cannot buy a home, start a business, perhaps even afford car payments as they join the work force. Their buying power is restricted by their high loan payments.

This is why the UWC Scholarship Program is so important. Each awarded scholarship helps a student in need achieve his or her academic goals and lessen the burden of starting off in deep debt. An Insíder's Víew of a Female Reporter In a Refugee Camp ín Uganda Aimee Heckel

Aimee Heckel graduated from Colorado State University with a degree in journalism and German and attended the University of Heidelberg in Germany with a concentration in international media.

Aimee Heckel is a professional journalist and storyteller who writes a weekly fashion column and fitness column, and who also covers pop culture, health, music, religion, food, home and garden, family, arts, and youth for the Boulder *Daily Camera*. She is a travel contributor for *USA Today* and has been the editor-in-chief of multiple women's magazines. She is a leader in digital journalism and has edited and contributed to more than twenty books including several Amazon best-sellers and award-winners. She teaches college–level workshops about mobile journalism, filming and editing videos, and blogging. She has won dozens of state and national writing awards.

In 2007, Aimee went on a dangerous assignment as a reporter in a Ugandan refugee camp that ended up changing the course of her life and many others. She learned about the plights of some of the neediest people in the world. The end result of her risky choice was surprising and took a completely different turn from what she would have ever expected.

Recently, Aimee returned from China, and perhaps she will tell us about that experience since it was different from Uganda and challenging in other ways.

After Aimee's presentation, a non-profit (Think-Humanity-African Handmade-Products) to which Aimee is affiliated, will **sell articles such as purses, toys, jewelry, etc. made by**

African women. Profits are used for malaria prevention, students' education, and other health care. 100% goes to the non-profit. Only cash or checks will be accepted. Any donation is accepted. A donation of \$10 is suggested.

Tell Me More... About what goes into our planning for our Lecture Luncheons

Planning for the five Lecture Luncheons is one of the primary responsibilities of the UWC Program Chair and her committee. Planning for the next year's Lecture Luncheons begins in the spring when the Program Chair is named. We are lucky to be in a community with a large pool of excellent speakers with interesting topics. The chair collects suggestions from UWC board and members, articles in the *Daily Camera*, personal knowledge, and proposals from previous years. She tries to include representatives from many fields and from both the University and the larger Boulder community.

Some UWC members have questioned the price for attending our Lecture Luncheons. Our Lecture Luncheons are not a fund-raising activity for UWC. The UWC Annual Budget sets the Program Committee's income to be equal to expenditures.

The food served at our Lecture Luncheons is not the only cost we must consider. In addition to the basic catering costs (food and drink, special meals, catering staff, table linens), we must cover the audio-visual equipment rental costs, hourly wages of AV technical staff, and the rental charges for podium and lectern, entry and display tables, easels, and coat racks. Our budget does not allow for payment to our speakers; they are all volunteers receiving only their meals, the meals of their guests, and our heartfelt thanks. Because UWC is considered a part of the University community, the rental costs for the room and tables and chairs at UMC are waived. When circumstances require the use of an outside venue, we must pay a room rental fee which greatly increases our costs.

We must provide our caterer with accurate counts of total expected attendance including exact numbers of the special meals. This is why we require advance reservations and advance orders for special meals. Some extra places are set – a few more than our expected attendance – not for walk-in guests, but so that late-comers can easily find a place to sit.

The Program Committee meets with our caterer to select menus. We try to pick interesting and varied luncheon choices. We also take note of our members' preferences. While many of us found the beef stew in October to be absolutely delicious, there were many others who chose not to eat it at all. So beef stew is off the menu for the future. We also know that our members enjoy the salads and take smaller portions of entrées, so we have requested additional salad to be available on the buffet, cutting back a bit on the entrée.

We learn as we go. We apologize for the long line at the November Lecture Luncheon. As Diana King noted, we are victims of our own success. For any future luncheons where our guest count is high, we will have two buffet lines, each serving on two sides. We have also changed the meeting venue to the Glenn Miller Central Ballroom for February and March to provide us with extra needed space. December's Lecture Luncheon must be held in Room 235 as the ballroom is unavailable. Seating will be somewhat limited, so be sure to get your reservation in early or we may reach capacity before your request is received.

Regardless of how carefully we plan, things do occasionally go awry. Our lines were too long in November, occasionally a speaker has to cancel and be replaced at the last minute, perhaps we run out of dessert, or there is a mix up in someone's reservation listing. The Program Committee and Hospitality do their best to make things right, and we all appreciate the patience and understanding of our members.



Interest Groups—Bicycling

Both UWC biking groups just finished their seasons after six whole months of pedaling in and around Boulder. Sharon Howrey started our forays about seven years ago then handed the leadership over to our intrepid leader, Mary Greenwald.

Twice a week, with just a few interludes for her international travel, Mary sends us an email detailing the rides for the week. We use a very simple online response program to let her know who can make it for any given outing and then rendezvous at the appointed time. What is particularly appealing to anyone who likes to ride bicycles is that there are two groups available.

If you are just getting into riding you can go on Wednesday mornings with the **Easy Riders** who start gently in the spring and work up to ten (usually flat) miles on bike paths with lots of time to talk and stop for coffee after the ride.

If you have been riding for a while and prefer more mileage, the Thursday group usually goes about 20 miles and still has time to chat and stop for coffee.



We have been very fortunate to have Carol Saunders invite us to her Frisco condo the last few summers to do some high country challenges. There is always someone riding sweep (behind everyone else) to make sure no one gets lost and we have an amazing safety record! Jump on your bike and join us! (Note that biking group meets May—October.)

Margaret Willard Award

Margaret Willard began her career at CU as an English instructor, wife of an history professor, and became the first president of the Faculty Wives' Club, which has evolved into a more encompassing group, our University Women's Club.

Though the original group liked to chat and sip tea, they grew in involvement in philanthropic matters. According to Sylvia Pettem, a Boulder local historian, these included providing eye-glasses and books to needy students, milk funds for schools, implementing student loans, and more.

The social aspects of their lives turned more and more to helping others as the world progressed through the Great Depression and World War II. By 1957, they added fund-raising and expanded the philanthropic work by providing financial scholarships for women, non-traditional females, to help them to continue their education. We continue this tradition and recently have included men for scholarship consideration.

Since 1993, the UWC has presented the Margaret Willard to a woman or women who have exemplified the traits of our predecessors, and in doing so honor all women.

The University Women's Club presents the Margaret Willard Award annually at the spring Honors Reception. The woman receiving the award must fulfill some or all of the following criteria:

- Demonstrate outstanding work in her field of endeavor
- Enhance the quality of life for women on the Boulder campus and/or in the Boulder community
- Be an exceptional role model
- Elevate women's performance
- Bring honor to all women and to the University/Boulder community through her accomplishments

There have been 36 previous recipients, including Patricia Limerick, Val Havlick, Carlen Penfold, Ruth M. Wright, Claudine Garby, and Ceal Barry. There is a complete list in the UWC Handbook, which was distributed electronically.

All our honorees are exemplary role models who exercise initiative in their endeavors and in doing so bring honor to all women and to our University.

In 2010, Beth Klein wrote a breakthrough anti-human trafficking law for Colorado, which led her to consulting to over 30 states and even to other countries, helping them to understand and create solutions to end human trafficking. She has worked all over the world, many times for free, trying to end human trafficking.

Bees' Needs and Our Environment

She works for CU Science Discovery, a program focused on K-12 science education. Dr. Rose is also the Director of Education and Outreach for the Niwot Ridge Long-Term Ecological Research program at the Mountain Research Station, Institute of Arctic and Alpine Research (INSTAAR), University of Colorado, near Nederland,



As you may know, in recent years, the popular media in the U.S. has been buzzing with news of mysteriously disappearing native bee populations and Western honey bees. These bees are re-

sponsible for pollinating over 75% of fruits, nuts, and vegetables grown the U.S.

Dr. Rose is excited about (and having fun) working alongside The Bees' Needs participants, a group of 500 individuals and families across the northern Front Range of Colorado, collecting bees' nesting blocks which provide information concerning the disappearance of these bees.

Tell Me More... About Dr. Patty Limerick

At our Lecture Luncheon of February 2015, Dr. Patty Limerick, Professor of History at CU and the co-founder, Faculty Director, and Chair of the Board of the Center for the American West at CU, presented to us some of her adventures while touring the state to present a balanced understanding on the subject of fracking, "FrackingSENSE: The Adventures of a Historian in a Tense Terrain." She has dedicated her career to bridging the gap between academics and the general public and to demonstrating the benefits of applying historical perspective to contemporary dilemmas and conflicts.

Already admired and credited with multiple awards and tributes, Patty Limerick has recently been granted two additional honors.



In January, the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH)

appointed Dr. Limerick to its advisory board, the National Council on the Humanities. Nominated by President Obama and confirmed by the US Senate, she joins just 25 other members to make recommendations on grant applications. NEH grants, totaling \$120-\$130 million annually, typically go to cultural institutions, such as museums, archives, libraries, colleges, universities, public television and radio stations, and to individual scholars.

Regarding her appointment Patty Limerick said, "...this appointment to the National Council for the Humanities gives me a chance ... to cheer for the under-utilized power of the humanities to benefit the nation and the world. This is a cause I have believed in since the bookcases of my hometown public library provided my habitat of preference..." See her full letter by clicking here.

Also in January, Governor Hickenlooper named Dr. Limerick as the new Colorado State Historian. The appointment strengthens the collaborative partnership between CU and History Colorado, the state agency that runs its major museums and maintains its archives.



On the History Colorado website, Patty Limerick has asked for input from interested residents of Colorado. She writes in an open letter to Colorado friends, "As I begin my term, I ask for your help... Is there a particular story about an event, a place, a person, or anything else, that you believe would anchor a compelling museum exhibit? Is there a topic that you believe our state history museum should engage, puzzle over, and call to the attention of the state's residents and visitors? Is there a particular physical object or a group of objects in our collection that you think should be displayed? "

"Please share your ideas for History Colorado's future exhibits by filling out the form we have set up at <u>www.historycolorado.org/colorados-story-form</u> ... Please share your ideas by February 29. Since we are hoping for a great cascade of suggestions, we shouldn't give the impression that every idea you have is on its way to a display case. But the suggestions we receive will give us our GPS system, as we map our way into the future of History Colorado's museums around the state."

If you have suggestions for our State Historian, please submit them by February 29.

Tell Me More... About Heart Health

At our Lecture Luncheon of November 2009, Dr Nelson Trujillo presented "How to Prevent Cardiac Death – the Number One Killer of Women". His discussion focused on ways to keep our hearts healthy, including tips about diet, exercise, and stress. Today, heart disease remains the number one killer of women, causing one of every three deaths in women annually. Even with the best of intentions and healthful activities, some of us, or persons we love, will fall victim to this peril. **So what can we do to improve the chances of surviving a heart attack or cardiac arrest?**

First, we need to be aware that these terms are not interchangeable. **Heart attack** is a circulatory problem where a blocked artery prevents nourishment to the heart. Experts recommend the following steps to survive a heart attack:

- 1. Recognize the symptoms. They can be different for women and can include shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting, sweating, and back or jaw pain.
- 2. Call 911. Don't waste time looking up symptoms on the internet or calling your primary care physician.
- 3. Chew and swallow a 325 milligram aspirin and wait for the EMT. If possible, call someone to wait with you.
- 4. Be assertive. Tell the EMT you think you are having a heart attack. Tell the EMT the medications you take.
- 5. Don't feel bad if it was a false alarm. For emergency rooms to catch all heart attacks, there are going to be some situations where nothing serious is wrong.

Cardiac arrest is an "electrical" problem that disrupts the pumping action of the heart. Cardiac arrest can result from a heart attack, but there are other causes. Unless treatment occurs within minutes, the victim will die. More than 90% of cardiac arrests that occur outside a hospital result in death. Immediate cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) doubles or triples the chance of survival, and anyone can do it, even without training.

Steps to save a life:

- 1. Call 911 or send someone to call.
- 2. With the heel of your hand, push hard and fast at the center of the chest. Push 100-120 compressions per minute. Appropriately, you can do this to the disco beat of "Staying Alive".
- 3. Keep going until help arrives.

With the new CPR, mouth to mouth breathing is no longer recommended, and you don't need formal training. For a person in cardiac arrest you can't possibly hurt them by trying, even if you were to break his or her rib. If you don't try, the person will die. You just might save a life.

We are pleased to announce that the recipient of the 2016 Margaret Willard Award is Lorrie Shepard, Distinguished Professor and Dean of the University of Colorado School of Education. One can trace the path of Dr. Shepard through the School of Education and see the parallel growth and recognition of the institution in academic circles. Dr. Shepard earned a MA in Counseling, and PhD in Research and Evaluation Methodology at CU. After graduation and working for the California Department of Education, Lorrie joined the faculty of the School of Education. She has been Chair of Research and Evaluation Methodology from 1975 to the present, the

Director of Graduate Studies, and is Dean of the School of Education.

Lorrie Shepard

US News and World Reports 2016 ranks the School of Education 28th and the graduate program, Education Policy, 10th in the nation.

Lorrie has led the effort to bring top research and teaching faculty to the school. Under her leadership, exemplary programs are improving K-12 education and teacher training in local schools. The faculty scholarly productivity is ranked 10th. The number of grants has increased. She has secured funding for faculty and student research, allowing graduate students to study full time. STEM has increased cooperation with other departments. Partnerships with pre-K to 12 local schools have been strengthened, utilizing master teachers and graduate students in undergrad teacher education. Other community partnerships include CU Engage and the BUENO Center.

Lorrie has been president and received awards from the major education groups including AERA, NCME, ETS, AACTE. She has conducted extensive large-scale studies on learning disabilities, grade retention, kindergarten screening and teacher testing, and use/ misuse of tests in educational settings. Most recently her research studies have addressed use of classroom assessment to support teaching and learning.

Lorrie is a role model for students and faculty, professionally and personally. She leads through example, encouragement, and being part of a working group. Faculty and students are enabled to do their best and to improve research, teaching, and learning.

Tell Me More... About the MAVEN mission



At our Lecture Luncheon in October 2015, Dr. Bruce Jakosky fascinated us with the adventure of the MAVEN spacecraft which had just completed its first year in orbit and second year in space, a culmination of the previous decade of effort and planning. For those who missed the lecture, see a short summary video at http://mars.nasa.gov/maven/. Scroll down the page and click on "Investigating the Martian Atmosphere". On the website you'll find a lot of other neat stuff, including coloring pages for the grandkids.

Because of the great success of its primary mission, the year of orbit that began 10 months after MAVEN was launched at Cape Canaveral and included five "deep dip campaigns" and a close encounter with the comet Siding Spring, NASA approved MAVEN for an extended mission of additional science operations. If all continues to go as hoped, MAVEN has plenty of fuel to continue 29 additional months in its

original orbit pattern after which it could operate for another six years, performing a combination of science operations and Rover communications relay in orbit at a further distance from Mars in order to delay its final demise.

The close encounter with Siding Spring gave scientists a bird's eye view of the havoc wreaked on Mars as the comet streaked by only 87,000 miles from the planet (this is "only" in astronomical terms!). The MAVEN team believes "the encounter blew away part of Mars' upper atmosphere, much like a strong solar storm would." Mars' magnetic field was in complete chaos. "With MAVEN, we're trying to understand how the sun and solar wind interact with Mars. By looking at how the magnetosphere of the comet and Mars interact with each other, we're getting a better understanding of the detailed processes that control each one," said Bruce Jakosky.



Toward the end of 2015, MAVEN made several passes within 300 miles of the Mars' moon Phobos. The spectral images collected in the flybys may allow MAVEN scientists to determine the composition of Phobos, whose origin is unknown. It may help them determine if Phobos is a captured asteroid or was formed in orbit around Mars. The data will also help them look for organic molecules on the surface.
