The book chosen for this meeting is one readily available at all supermarkets. It is "Ragtime" by L.L. Doctorow. It was chosen when we


learned that our choice made in June was out of print.

This meeting will be Wednesday, October 27 at 1:00 at Sue McMillan's home at 485 Baseline Rd. At this time a local stock broker will speak to


the group. New members are invited to join.





Thanks to all who have helped with this project.


May Fair in Denver
