### OPEN LETTER TO THE MEMBERS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO WOMEN'S CLUB

Dear Members:

Many years ago members of the Faculty Women's Club acquired beautiful coffee and tea silver plate services. They also acquired trays, spoons, forks, urns, etc. Before the Memorial Center was built and the meetings were held in Old Main, at the President's House, and other buildings on Campus, these silver pieces were always used for teas and parties given by the Club and by the President of the University. Also these tea services were rented to Sororities and Fraternities and to other University groups. The income from these rentals was used to pay for the insurance of the silver and for its upkeep.

As time went by the use for these silver pieces diminished and they have spent most of the time stored in a closet at the UMC and lately they have been stored at the Koenig Alumni Center. Also the insurance premiums continued to multiply.

After due study and consideration a committee was charged to put this silver back in use again.

We are happy to report that the University Foundation will store and put the silver into use again. The silver will be available to the Club and to any of its members as directed by the acting board. The Foundation will be responsible for the safe-keeping of the silver and in return will contribute to the Student Fund Scholarship in the name of the UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO WOMEN'S CLUB - BOULDER.

SUBJECT: Christmas Party

The State Fiscal Rules specifically prohibit a Christmas party, dances or receptions sponsored with "State funds" for its employees. The rule relates only to "State funds" and would require some additional consideration if the funds of some special purpose were applied. There would be no problem in holding the function if it were paid for by its participants, even though the money flowed through the University systems. Alcoholic beverages are also permitted if State funds are not utilized.

It would be necessary to arrange a sale of tickets or to seek sponsorship of an organization other than the University to continue the function.
