Dear UWC Members,

We are delighted to welcome you to another year with the University Women's Club. For several years, we have prided ourselves on maintaining the \$5 annual dues when other community organizations have assessed members anywhere from \$10 to \$35 or more. However, inflation has eaten into our funds along with everyone else's. As costs of postage, printing, and food services have increased, we have tried to keep operating costs within budget by asking members to contribute food for club activities and by using money from the club's reserve fund. In recent years, the practice of donating food has decreased in popularity and the reserve fund has been reduced to a minimal amount.

This year, we are planning many new programs and service projects as well as some To carry out such a program, the 1984/85 Executive Board anticipates expenses of \$2225 for the upcoming year, based on actual expenses of the past year. These costs include the printing and mailing of Msages, and the membership directory, refreshments and program costs of monthly general meetings and interest groups, and a donation to the Macky renovation. As you know, we do not charge to attend any of the programs or interest groups, so the dues are our only way of defraying some of the club's costs. Dues of \$5 each from 250 members would provide only \$1250. Several choices exist: reduce activities of the club to fit within actual receipts, charge individually for each program, double our membership, or raise dues. Given the difficulties involved in each alternative, we have opted for the last choice. Therefore, we are raising dues for 1984/85 to \$10 per member and \$5 minimum per retired member.

In early September, the annual membership letter will give details of the coming year's program. We look forward to your participation and your support in the months ahead.






