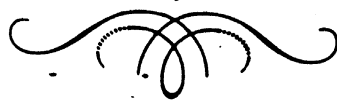

Kristina Johnson is an Assistant Professor in the Electrical and Computer Engineering Department at the University of Colorado, Boulder. She was named Presidential Young Investigator by the National Science Foundation in 1985 and has been with CU-Boulder since 1985. Kris earned her bachelor's (1979), master's (1981), and doctorate (1983) degrees from Stanford University. A NATO Post-Doctoral Fellow at Trinity College, she studied in Dublin, Ireland from 1983 to 1985. She was a visiting scientist at IBM Research Laboratories in San Jose, California and has received several honors and awards. She has eleven publications to her credit, along with two patent-pending inventions, including a holograph sundial.

Dr. Ronald Bernier

Dr. Ronald Bernier has been with the University of Colorado since 1971 and is currently a professor of Art History in the Fine Arts Department. He received his B.A. from the University of Minnesota, his M.A. from the University of Hawaii and his Ph.D. from Cornell University. Dr. Bernier has been a recipient of the University of Colorado's Teaching Award.

Dr. Bernier is the past President of the National Association for Himalayan studies and is a member of the Boulder Lhasa Sister City Project. He has just completed his third trip to Tibet where he served as lecturer for the New York American Museum of Natural History. He has also published five books on Himalayan Architecture. The slides he will show are his own and these slides have toured the United States as part of a Himalayan Exhibition. We are fortunate to have this outstanding speaker volunteer his time and talents for the UWC. Dr. Bernier must also have a sense of humor because he liked our title **Bernier and Chardonay**. 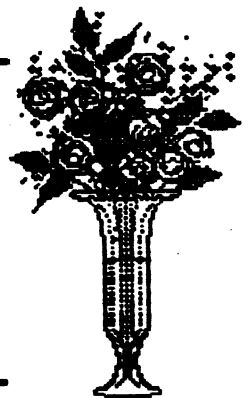

UWC LOGO

A new logo for the UWC was created in 1982. Rosemary McBride, one of next year's co-presidents was responsible for bringing this about. Here is a review of the pertinent facts surrounding this seal which appears on the front of the 1988 - 1989 Year Book. Al Slobodin from C.U.'s Graphic Arts executed the suggested layout. Most of the following text is taken from an article written by Rosemary in 1982.

1918 was the date of the beginning of our organization. At that time we were called Faculty Wives. Since then we have broadened our membership to include staff of C.U. - thus the change in name to University Women.

Hellems building is featured on the logo for several reasons. 1918 also marked the beginning of the construction of Hellems and it was the first building on campus to feature Charles Klauder's rural Italian architecture which sets apart the beauty and continuity of our C.U. campus. In addition, Hellems serves as the entry to the Mary Rippon Theatre. Mary Rippon was a woman who played a prominent role in the early history of C.U. The flame at the top of the logo is an integral part of the C.U. seal, just as University Women play an integral role in the University of Colorado.
