Scholarship Update

The University Women's Club Scholarship at the University of Colorado at Boulder was established in 1982 to aid outstanding women students who are over 24 years old and are returning to CU after a break in their college education. It has served as a focus for fundraising activity and a way for the UWC to offer tangible support to younger women.

Scholarships for women returning to school are critically needed. The University Women's Club Scholarship has been deeply appreciated by those students who have received it. These women also see it as a tremendous boost to their morale as they continue the difficult task of study often mixed with responsibilities of family and job.

To date, a total of 16 scholarships totalling over \$10,000 have been awarded. This is an average of \$625 per scholarship. Students from a variety of disciplines have received this financial aid.

With the success and hard work of our spring fashion show fundraising event this year, we were able to award three scholarships. A \$1000 scholarship was awarded to a graduate student in Communication Disorders and Speech Science. Two \$625 scholarships were also awarded, one to a graduate student working toward a Master of Science in Education, and one to an undergraduate student pursuing a dual degree in Mathematics and Music.

We salute their dedication and hard work and are pleased to encourage them with our scholarships.

Notice of Intention to Amend the UWC Constitution and By-laws

The changes suggested by the committee for the <u>UWC Constitution and By-Laws</u> have been approved by the UWC Board. Copies of the amended constitution and by-laws will be distributed to UWC members during the month of April.

The UWC Board has spent some time on these revisions this year. Most of the suggested changes are to clarify what is already standard practice or to update the language used.


