Julia Johnson Lecture/Luncheon Series Anasazi Basketmaker: Reverse Archaeology February 8th, Tuesday

On Tuesday, February 8th, Julia Johnson will present a two projector slide show entitled Anasazi Basketmakers: Reverse Archaeology. "Julie", as we know her, is a new member and editor of *Messages* this year. You might think from the title of her program that she is an archaeologist, but her background is far removed from digging into the past.

A transplant from Wisconsin, where at the age of eighteen she earned a private pilot's license, Julie has been a resident of Boulder for 45 years. She earned a Master's Degree from the Communications Disorder Department at CU after she had travelled abroad, owned a business called "Party Planners", spent a couple years as a private secretary, was Principal and taught seventh and eighth grades in the "old Dillon" (before Lake Dillon), was a ski patroller at Arapaho Basin, married and became a mother to one child, a son, Brad who is a wellknown Colorado mountaineer. Before graduation she was secretary to Bob Beattie, Olympics commentator and then CU Ski Team Coach. She had her own private practice as a Speech Pathologist and continued to travel around the world with her husband testing outdoor equipment developed by their business known as Frostline Kits. During that time she learned to fly a float plane and therefore also holds a seaplane license. Julie has climbed many high peaks in North and South America, Africa, Europe, Japan, and New Zealand. Besides all this she enjoys biking, hiking, skiing, rollerblading, racket ball, golf and tennis. In more recent years, while hiking in canyons of the southwest, she became involved in an unusual research project called the Wetherill-Grand Gulch Research Project.

This program will tell you how she and two other Boulder women, Ann Hayes, and Ann Phillips, became part of a small research team determined to reconstruct history which took place a hundred years ago. Their endeavor involved a canyon in southeastern Utah called Grand Gulch. This 54 mile long canyon empties into the San Juan River and was home to the largest community of Anasazi Basketmaker Indians anywhere in the southwest between 700 and 1300 A.D. They hoped to discover collections which had been removed from the canyon during the late 1800s by about twelve expeditions, most notably several expeditions by the same men who discovered Mesa Verde, the Wetherill brothers from Mancos, Colorado.

After four years they located collections, reconnected them to their original burial site, gathered written information concerning the expeditions and photographed collections in two national museums. In May 1990 they concluded their work with a symposium, the largest of its kind attended by 500 professional and amateur archaeologists. They were presented the highest award given by the Department of the Interior to volunteers contributing to the conservation and management of natural and cultural resources of the United States.

On Tuesday, March 8th, Lillian Kennedy will take a blank 30" X 40" canvas and proceed with some vigor to demonstrate her painting process.

Lillian has a masters degree in painting from Parsons School of Design where she attended on a Helena Rubenstein scholarship. Before moving to Boulder four years ago, she developed a reputation in NYC for her large scale commissioned paintings some of which are at the Sunset Park Courthouse, the Tavern on the Green, DuMont Plaza, and the Bronx Zoo. Although she loved the visual blast experienced from motoring up and down a mural on a scaffold while feeling engulfed by a painted image, she has since turned her attention to moderate sized paintings of landscapes and gardens.

Lillian was born in Vermont and raised in a small isolated town there. From her earliest years she felt a strong connection with the landscape, and by the time that she finished high school this had begun to grow into an obsession to use the landscape as a catalyst for the expression in paint of her feeling about life.

In her paintings, Lillian strives to balance a charged emotionalism with a quiet serenity; synthesizing these and other disparate qualities into a somewhat unified mode of expression remains an ongoing process. Her paint strokes function not only to describe nature but also as energetic and unpredictable visual events which create pattern and energy. She aims to create a glowing, tingling surface that coalesces into a grand rhythmic whole when the viewer steps back. Change is an integral part of the process, and the painting becomes a record of the dance of the brush in the moment of perception. She reworks her paintings by balancing and adjusting until she gets that special resonance that comes from the mirroring of inner sensations manifested visually. Sometimes this takes a few hours and at other times it happens over a period of years.

Throughout most of her career, Lillian has taught art. Most recently she taught Art Appreciation at CU in Denver. She hopes that this demonstration will give UWC members information that will be useful in their viewing of art and in their own creative endeavors.

She promises not to splash paint around.

MUSIC PROGRAM UPDATE

The old adage, "The show must go on!", can easily be applied to our Music Evening, Friday, January 28th, when the program's director, Dr. Dennis Jackson, filled in, and a talented piano student served as accompanist, replacing Dr. Robert Spillman.

Two of the seven College of Music scholarship winners scheduled to appear had laryngitis, and Dr. Spillman had been called away, so many of us were able, for the first time, to hear the talented Dr. Jackson, director of the Lyric Theatre Program, sing a solo, and he also joined in a duet with one of his students, both selections from "The Merry Widow". To the delight of the 100 or so audience, we were even treated to a waltz during the duet number.

Professor Jackson gave an overview of the spring productions of the College and excerpts from these were sung by the remaining five students, including a male tenor from Egypt and a female soprano from Russia, who sang arias from "The Marriage of Figaro".

Our thanks to President Rhoda Nozik who designed the invitations, to Nanwei Su, Mailing Chair, to Karen Diamond, in charge of refreshments, to Rosemary McBride and Telephone Tree members, and to all who baked for the event. Leftover cookies were donated to the Meals on Wheels Program via Special Projects Chair Claudine Garby.

The UWC Executive Board voted to give \$300 to the Lyric Theatre Scholarship Fund at its February meeting. The tradition of a Music Evening continues in 1995, when Dr. Jackson will direct our fourth annual program, tentatively set for Friday evening, January 27th.




