President's Message



The end of summer marks the beginning of UWC's year – and what a year it will be! 2019-20 is UWC's 100th anniversary – our activities of the year, from luncheon topics to an end of the year gala, will celebrate the centennial.

Our year will begin with the annual Fall Membership Tea on Tuesday, September 10th from 2:00-4:00 pm when we greet old and new members, sign up for interest groups and lecture luncheons, and have an opportunity to hear about plans for the year. This is an opportunity for members to bring friends and neighbors who may be interested in joining UWC and participating in its many programs. At the tea, you may renew your membership, sign up for lecture luncheons, and contribute to UWC's scholarship effort that supports the education of non-traditional students who have returned to CU to complete their studies.

Last year our members' generous donations allowed us to give over \$25,000 to six deserving undergraduates. Please try to join this effort by including a donation for scholarships along with your dues. (Donations may also be made throughout the year.) You will be so proud to have helped such amazing students reach their education goals.

The five Lecture Luncheons (October, November, January, February, March) will give UWC members and guests an exciting centennial overview of our environment (*CU Museum of Natural History: Window to the Past; A Door to the Future*), the climate (*Climate of Colorado over the Last 100 years*, at NCAR), CU's social history in the year UWC was founded (*The Story of Lucile B. B. Jones, the First Black Woman to Graduate from CU, 1919*), CU's Heritage Center (*We Were There at the Beginning*), and our region of the country (*Women and the West*). Because prices keep going up, the Board decided to increase the price for lecture luncheons to \$25 to cover costs. This is the first increase in five years.

Our centennial year will begin and end with two celebratory events. The first is publication of a Centennial book that highlights who we were and what we did over a century of activities, with fascinating stories gleaned from the CU archives and UWC members. This book will be a membership benefit for all – and ready in the fall. The second event is the May Gala – an event-filled UWC centennial birthday party for UWC members and guests. It's still in the planning stages but already promises to be a special evening of music, theater, and celebration.

This year UWC is going to explore online registration and payment for membership dues and lecture luncheons. You can renew your membership and pay your dues via PayPal or credit card – please see the link of UWC's home web page: http://boulderuwc.org. We hope to have lecture luncheon registration online by the time of the Member Tea.

2019-20 will be a vibrant year, driven by the engagement of your Board members, Interest Group chairs, and special event coordinators. It is a privilege for me, as 2019-20 President, to work with and learn from them and you, the UWC members. I am looking forward to seeing you all at UWC events and online!



A Window to the Past: A Door to the Future

Speaker: Dr. Deane Bowers

CU Museum of Natural History

Dr. Bowers is Chair of the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology and Curator of Entomology at the CU Natural History Museum. She has been fascinated by insects since she was small and has been able to follow such an early interest throughout the rest of her life. After completing her Ph.D. at the University of Massachusetts, and a two-year post-doc at Stanford, she spent eight years on the faculty at Harvard. She has served as a University of Colorado professor since 1989.

Her interests are in the interaction of insects with their environment and other organisms, especially chemical mediation of plant-insect-enemy interactions

and the effects of human alterations of the environment on these interactions. She works in a variety of systems, including butterflies and their host plants, predators and parasitoids, native bee communities, and insect immune responses to parasitoids and pathogens.





The Past, Present, and Future of Colorado's Climate
What We Know and Don't Know

Speaker: Dr. Russ Schumacher Director, Colorado Climate Center, CSU

Colorado's climate is fascinating, with huge yearly, even hourly, swings in temperature and precipitation caused in large part by our geography with vast plains meeting high mountain peaks. This presentation summarizes what we've learned about our state's weather and climate, with a particular focus on droughts, floods, and snowpack. Recent advances in observing and predicting our weather and climate will also be discussed, along with what we know and don't know about the future.

Dr. Schumacher with the Department of Atmospheric Science at Colorado State University also serves as the Colorado State Climatologist and Director of the Colorado Climate Center. His research is aimed at improving understanding and prediction of extreme precipitation. He collects data in the field and uses numerical models of the atmosphere. His other research and teaching interests include weather systems, mesoscale meteorology, and the climatology of precipitation.



Polly E. Bugros McLean shares insights from her book *Remembering Lucile: A Virginia Family's Rise from Slavery and a Legacy Forged a Mile High*, which explores the life of Lucile Berkeley Buchanan Jones, (1884-1989) an exceptional woman who history had forgotten and did not have a chance to author her own story. Lucile Berkeley Buchanan Jones was the first black woman to graduate from UC Boulder, graduating in 1919.

Dr. McLean has lectured, conducted workshops and research in southern Africa for USAID, UNESCO, as a Fulbright Scholar in Namibia, and a visiting professor at the University of Zambia. McLean is the recipient of numerous awards and honors including the 2014 Best Should Teach Gold Award, the 2009 Edward R. Murrow Award for teaching, and the 2007 Robert L. Stearns Award.


Karen Bell

She was an Affiliate Professor of History at Metropolitan State University of Denver and published her first book, Boulder: 1859-1919 in 2008. Mona is currently working on a book about Boulder's beloved nineteenth-century photographer, Joseph Bevier and "Rocky Mountain Joe" Sturtevant.







Colorado is not uniformly wet









She earned her Master's degree in Public History at Boston's Northeastern University and is currently the Curator of History and Collections at the CU Heritage Center.

In addition to her museum work, Mona has worked with several museums in Massachusetts, Denver, and Boulder. She was an Affiliate Professor of History at Metropolitan State University of Denver and published her first book, Boulder: 1859-1919 in 2008. Mona is currently working on a book about Boulder's beloved nineteenth-century photographer, Joseph Bevier and "Rocky Mountain Joe" Sturtevant.

Limerick has dedicated her career to bridging the gap between academics and the general public and to demonstrating the benefits of applying historical perspective to contemporary dilemmas and conflicts. nominated by President Obama confirmed by the US Senate. She is the Faculty Director and Chair of the Board of the Center of the American West at the University of Colorado, where she is also a Professor of History.





President's Message



Merry Bullock, UWC President, 2019-20

In typical years, the April President's Message is all about reawakening, spring, and capstone events for the end of the year. As we all know, this spring is like none other. We are in the middle of a period of uncertainty that calls on us to practice responsible individual, family and community behaviors.

As I write this column, Boulder, Colorado and the USA are still beginning to see the effects of the novel corona virus pandemic that is sweeping the world. We do not know how this will all turn out, but we can learn from those countries who have been hit harder already what the triggers are.

One of the primary messages to us now is to practice social distancing. I worry we are not taking it seriously enough. Certainly, our city and state governments have acted to help the process. Community places are closed; large gatherings are prohibited; and we are told to stay home and avoid groups (along with handwashing and other public health measures). But I am

not sure how many of us are really "pulling the trigger" to stop our outings.

The UWC membership will be informed via email as soon as any decisions are made.

Beyond the major all-UWC groups, though, our primary social activities are through UWC interest groups. What does social distancing mean in this context? How do we balance the needs for social distancing with the parallel need for social connection? Our collective age makes us most at risk for the corona virus; yet at the same time our collective age makes it most important to avoid social isolation (research shows that a strong correlate of longevity is social connection). These are some of the questions that will be occupying your board in its next meeting (which will undoubtedly be virtual). I hope that UWC can define a role for itself and its members. Perhaps we can come up with some creative ideas to help UWC remain socially active even if through virtual events!

What have we been doing and what is to come?

Our March Lecture Luncheon was well attended and a special treat to hear Patty Limerick take us on a tour of Western history through the eyes of army wives. We also elected our officers for 2020-21 (see them listed elsewhere in MESSAGES).

There were also some important announcements about next year – top among them that the lecture luncheon **meeting times** and **meeting dates** are changing. These changes are because of scheduling and logistical challenges – but in the end may increase engagement. Lecture luncheons will now begin with a lecture from 10:30-11:30 with lunch following. An added bonus is you can arrive as early as 10 am, grab a cup of coffee or tea and chat with friends before the lecture.

When families are stretched beyond capacity, she aims to offer a therapeutic approach replacing extreme fear and isolation with

support, guidance, tolerance and kindness. Debby is an inspiration in her compassionate drive.

At one time Alana Brummel defined herself as a drug addict, living a life without discipline or hope. Four years ago she became pregnant and realized she would be parenting alone. With hard work and determination, she overcame her drug addiction. She transformed her life because her child was dependent upon her. Alana enrolled at Southwest Community College in Memphis.

Today she is an honor student at CU majoring in mechanical engineering. She is passionate about preserving the earth and the systems that support human life. Alana believes that energy generation and consumption are the largest threats to nature. She plans


to study the various energy solutions to discover how they can work together effectively.

Samuel Lillibridge



Seeking a Historian!


